

Vancouver Shrinks Seattle's Margin

The Vancouver Mounties are making a run for first place in the Pacific Coast league and their formula is a simple one — just beat the league leaders.

They did it again Sunday with a 5-2 victory over front-running Seattle which saw its league lead shrink to just one game. It was Vancouver's third straight win over Seattle and the two teams have a double bill coming up today.

In other action, Salt Lake City edged San Diego 6-5 and Tacoma topped Hawaii 2-1 for its fifth straight victory. The scheduled Portland at Spokane doubleheader was postponed because of rain and the second Hawaii-Tacoma game was called in the seventh with the score 1-1 to allow Hawaii time to catch a plane for the Islands.

George Bamberger and Phil Paine combined to pitch Vancouver to its victory as 14 Rainiers wilted on the basepaths.

Seattle outlived the Mounties by a 12-9 margin but could

score only single runs in the first and second when shortstop Curt Jensen belted a solo homer. Vancouver matched that with single markers in the first and third.

Ed Charles lofted a sacrifice fly in the fourth that sent in the eventual winning run for Vancouver although the Mounties came back with single runs in the seventh and eighth to insure the victory.

Seattle went through four pitchers with the last one, Arnie Farley, giving up his first earned run in 16 innings in the eighth.

Dusty Rhodes drove in both Tacoma runs in the Giant victory over Hawaii. His single in the fourth sent one across and he singled in the winning run in the bottom of the eighth.

Dom Zanni took care of the pitching chores with a nifty sixhitter.

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Welterweight Bout Won By Fernandez

New York — (UPI) — Stocky, black-haired Jorge Fernandez of Argentina moved toward a welterweight title shot by beating tall Ted Wright of Detroit with a combination body- and head attack Saturday for a unanimous 10-round decision in their nationally televised fight at St. Nicholas arena.

The victory earned Fernandez another TV fight with ex-champion Benny (Kid) Paret at Madison Square Garden on July 15. Should Paret lose to Fernandez that night, he may be replaced by Jorge as challenger against the June 3 title bout between champion Emile Griffith and Gaspar Ortega at Los Angeles.

Fernandez, favored at 7-5 and weighing 150½ pounds, won in a convincing manner although he suffered a gashed left brow and a cut below his left eye in the fifth round.

Sanders not only came, he conquered. He fired three 68's and a 69.

His two chief competitors were the other two members of his threesome, Jerry Steel-smith and Dave Ragan, who were five and six-under par respectively to tie for second at 274.
