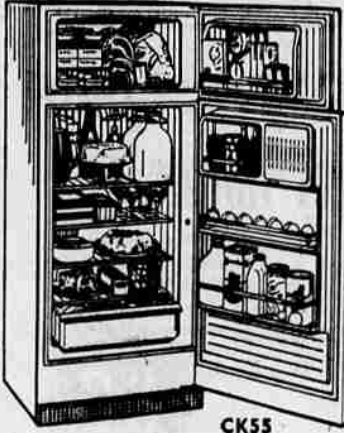

Maps showing the proposed boundaries will be on display, and procedures to be followed in the formation of the district will be explained, he said.

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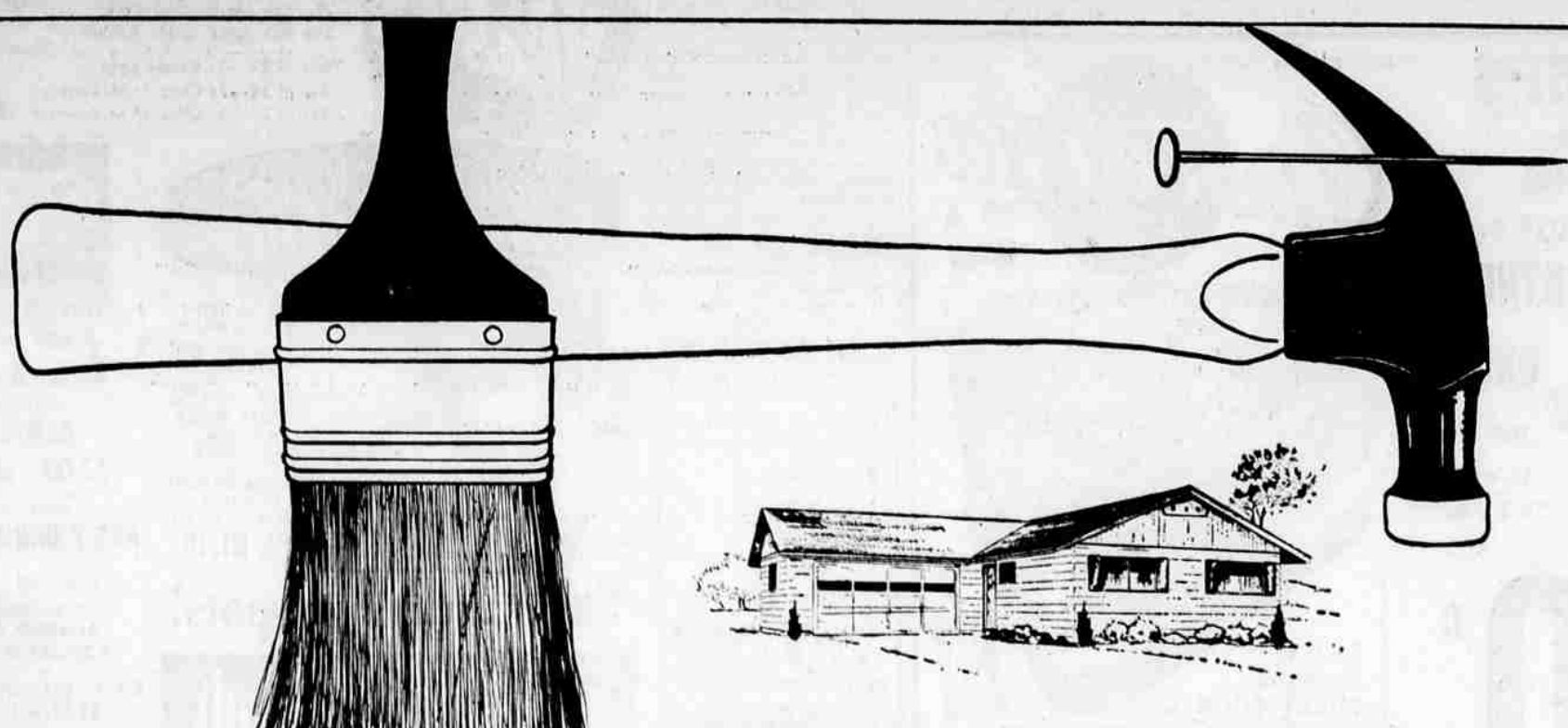
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
