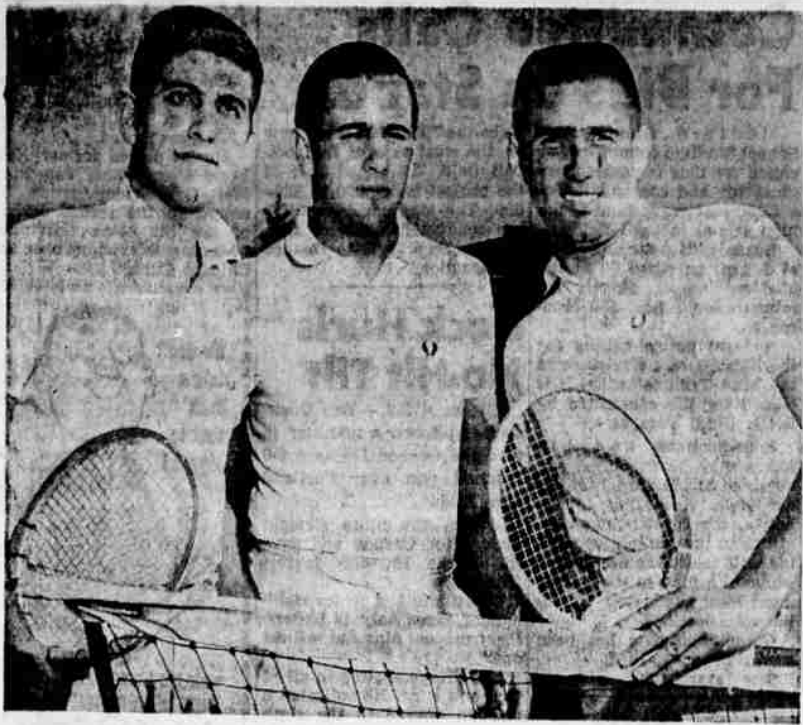

Tornado Downs KF By Margins of 3-1

Identical scores of 3 to 1 were chalked at Klamath Falls yesterday as the Medford high varsity baseball aggregation swept a double bill over the Klamath Union high Pelicans.

Victory in the first game restored Medford to the lone lead in the Southern Oregon conference with its third win in three counting games. Klamath stayed in third place with a 1-1 standing behind the 2-0 of the idle Ashland Grizzlies. Medford meets Ashland on Wednesday.

Medford scored all of its runs in the final inning in each game, getting the three in the seventh frame of the opener after two were out. Klamath tabulated in the first canto of each contest.

Stuart Young walked to start the Tornado on its way in the closing frame of the opener. Dick Deffley doubled him home and Mike Barnes singled Deffley to third base. On a double steal try KF catcher Mike Kitching heaved the ball into left field. Deffley scored with Barnes moving to third. Dan Miles doubled Barnes home.

Klamath got its run on a walk, a sacrifice by Bud Wolter and an error.

Six-Hitter

Young walked one batter and fanned three in a six-hit pitching effort. Marv Edwards hurled seven-hit ball for Klamath. He walked one and fanned three also, Rich Jack-

son faced one batter and struck him out.

For Medford in the fifth panel of the second game, Wayne Couch and Bob Schroeder singled and Miles tripled. Deffley smacked a sacrifice fly. Klamath got its marker on a walk, error and single by Sherm Allen.

Pitcher Steve Ray held Klamath to two hits over the first four innings of the second mix, giving three bases on balls and striking out two. Craig Laurance retired the side in the last inning, one-two-three.

Rich Jackson went the hill route for Klamath in a five-hitter. He recorded a walk and a strikeout.

Deffley had four hits in four official batting turns in the two frays, giving him a current streak of seven for seven.

**Kenny Lane
Tops Molina

San Jose, Calif. — (UPI) — Veteran southpaw Kenny Lane gave previously unbeaten Luis Molina a master boxing lesson through the first seven rounds and then withstood a furious assault through the last three stanzas to win a unanimous decision Saturday night.

It was the first professional defeat for the 23-year-old Molina, who had won 20 in a row with 17 knockouts. There were no knockdowns although there were several slips to the canvas.

Never before had Molina run up against the experience displayed by the 30-year-old Lane. The veteran from Muskegon, Mich., jabbed with his right and then rocked Molina's head repeatedly with short rights all through the fight.

Meanwhile Molina, who came in at 137½ to Lane's 138½, was swinging wildly and missing by as much as six inches to a foot as Lane danced easily out of danger.

Eagle Point Wins From Rogue River

Eagle Point — Eagle Point high nosed Rogue River 5 to 4 on Friday in their initial clash in Rogue league baseball.

The winning run was walked home in the bottom of the seventh inning with two out.
