"Greatest Life Ever Lived"

Events and teachings from the life of Christ as depicted by artists from many lands who designed postage stamps are reproduced today in observance of Palm Sunday. The stamps are a part of the collection of Mrs. Mabel Hauck, member of the Southern Oregon Stamp club, who entitled the booklet "The Greatest Life Ever Lived."



A Grecian stamp illustrates the parable of the Good Samaritan. "A certain man went down to Jerusalem to Jericho, and fell among thieves... but a certain Samaritan... had compassion on him and set him on his own beast and brought him to an inn..." Luke 10:30-34.



From Argentina Mrs. Hauck secured a stamp depicting the famous "Christ of the Andes" statue which "declares His triumph and His place of divine guidance in the world of living men."



One of the more artistic stamps in the collection devoted to Christ is this Madonna and Child issued by the Saar, a region of Germany. The collection includes stamps from The Congo, Ireland, Belgium, New Zealand, Trieste, Israel, and other lands.



Mrs. Hauck chose a stamp from Italy to illustrate the fact that Jesus was a teacher. Her Bible verse reads in part "he went throughout every city and village preaching and showing the glad tidings of the Kingdom of God..." Luke 8:1.



A Vatican stamp illustrates the flight into Egypt of the Holy family. The accompanying quotation is "The angel of the Lord appeareth to Joseph in a dream, saying 'Arise and take the young child and his Mother, and flee into Egypt... for Herod will seek the young child to destroy Him.'" Matt. 2:13.



An elaborately engraved stamp designed by a German artist has the empty cross, so significant to the Christian religion, as its central feature.



A Spanish stamp depicts the story of Christ's baptism. In the collection it is accompanied by this quotation: "Then came Jesus from Galilee to Jordan unto John to be baptized by Him." Matt. 3:13.
