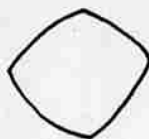
Answer: The dial (it spells laid backwards).

Bombardier By Robert Besch

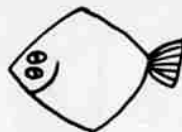
Fill a tub or dishpan with water and set it in the middle of the back yard. With crayon, mark 10 jar lids with numbers from 1 to 10 and float them on the water. Players stand about eight feet from the tub and try to sink the "ships," using marbles as "bombs."

Each player gets three tries. The game ends when everyone has taken a turn. Each player keeps track of the "ships" he sinks and totals his points. The highest total determines the champion bombardier.

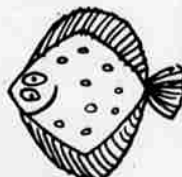
Let's Draw a Flounder By Ann Davidow

Who blends right in with the ocean floor.

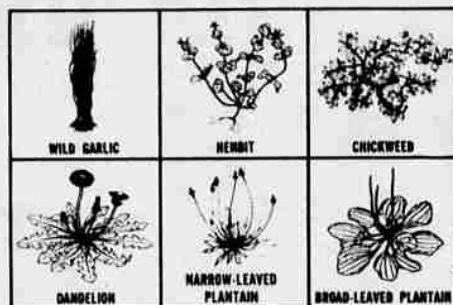


His eyes (among his spots galore),
