360,000 Anglers Expected To Go Fishing Saturday

Portland - (AP) - The State Game Commission says it expects 360,000 anglers to go fishing Saturday, the opening day of the general trout season in Oregon.

It reminded fishermen that with few exceptions the high lakes within National forests along the Cascades will remain closed until May 26 as will all coastal streams in Zone 1. Coastal lakes in Zone 1 will be open.

The commission mentioned several areas as potential hot spots. Detroit reservoir, south-east of Salem, is stocked heavily each year and is a favorite of bank fishermen. Presconson plants have been made in most streams throughout the McKenzie district. Santiam and Clackamas rivers also were stocked.

Small Streams Best
Smaller streams are expected to be the best in the Portland area.

Coastal lakes said to be good bets include Munsell, Siltcoos, Tahkenitch, Wauhink, Floras, Loon and Tenmile.

Except for Lake Creek, the North Umpqua and tributaries above Soda springs open Saturday and should be good fishing. Copco impoundments also are open.

In the Rogue river area, anglers can test their luck in the main river above Laurelhurst bridge and Big Butte creek and tributaries above Cobleigh road bridge. Streams of the Talent project do not open until May 26. Neither do Willow Creek reservoir tributaries.

Heavy Attention
The Deschutes and Metolius rivers in Central Oregon will get heavy attention. Lakes opening in that area include Wickiup, Big Cultus, Suttle, Blue, Odell and Crescent. Roads in some cases may be poor.

In northeast Oregon streams could be spoiled by any sudden thaw which would put them out of shape in a few hours. The Burnt river below Unity dam and Powder river above Baker are likely hot spots. Small streams in the John Day basin should be good.

Morgan lake should be good and Wallowa Lake fair. The Minam, Imnaha, Grande Ronde and Wallowa rivers expected to be good.

In southeast Oregon Delinquent lake is not accessible. Ana reservoir is one of the better bets. Most streams in this area will not receive plants of hatchery trout until rivers and creeks drop.

Phillip Moyer Back in Ring
Portland - (AP) - Phil Moyer, once one of boxing's top names, gets back in the ring tonight.

Moyer will launch a comeback attempt against Herb LeSeur in a six-round middleweight fight at the Portland Armory.

Moyer, who retired last April and who now fights out of Eugene, is favored against LeSeur, a soldier from Ft. Lewis, Wash.

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Ducks Will Vie Friday Against OSU

University of Oregon, Eugene - The University of Oregon, riding the surge of an 11-game winning streak, inaugurates Northern division baseball action this week-end against traditional rival Oregon State.

Coach Don Kirsch's Webfoots battle the Beavers at Howe Field Friday at 3 p.m. then move to Corvallis for the second game of the series.

Bob Christiansen (4-1), senior righthander, has been named as the probable pitching choice for Friday's league opener by Kirsch with either senior Jon Swanson (3-0) or sophomore Arba Ager (3-0) likely candidate for Saturday's encounter.

The Ducks have benefited from exceptional pitching in compiling a 17-4-1 record in non-conference competition. Christiansen threw a no-hitter in his last outing, Ager preceded that effort by hurling a one-hitter, and a day earlier Swanson pitched seven innings of no-hit ball.

In golf, the Webfoots compete in the 17th annual California tournament at Santa Cruz Thursday through Saturday, while Coach Dick Williams' tennis team is in Seattle this week-end for a Friday match with Seattle University and a Saturday tussle with the University of Washington.

Women's AAU Swim Under Way
Sacramento, Calif. - (AP) - The Women's National AAU Indoor Swimming and Diving championships get under way today with the Santa Clara, Calif. Swim Club expected to dominate the first day's competition.

On the agenda today were the 100-yard free style, 250-yard breaststroke, 200-yard backstroke and 400-yard individual medley. Preliminaries each day will be at 10 a.m., with the finals starting at 4 in the afternoon.

Young Terri Stickles of Santa Clara was favored in the 100, with major competition coming from Robin Ann Johnson of the Arlington, Va., Aquatic Club; Carolyn Wood, U.S. Olympic team member from Portland, Ore., and Donna de Varona, also of Santa Clara.

In the 250-yard breaststroke, best time reported this year is a 3:16.2 by Roby Whipple of Santa Clara. Linda Kurtz, Santa Clara, has a close 2:17.2. Other top competitors are Alice Driscoll, Louisville, Ky., and Jean Dellakamp, Indianapolis.

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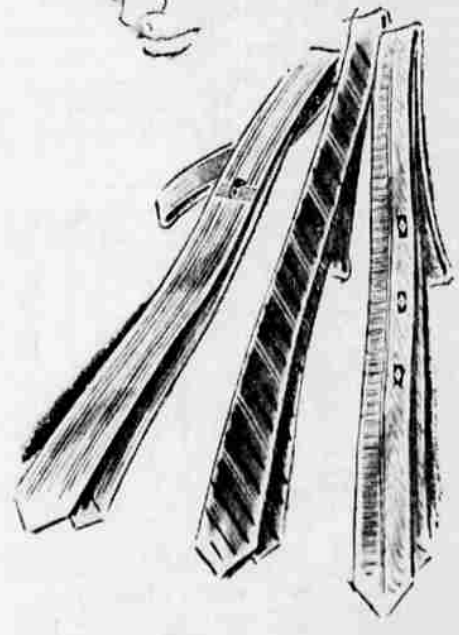
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
