Oksanen Winner of Marathon

Boston — (UPI) — Lacking a human shadow to pace them, Finland's Eino Oksanen and Paavo Pystonen used wrist watches and machine-legs to finish 1-2 in Thursday's 66th Boston Marathon.

Finns have won the race for the past four years and five out of the last seven.

It was Oksanen's second consecutive marathon win and his third victory in four tries.

Oksanen trotted 26 miles, 385 yards from Hopkinton to downtown Boston in 2 hours, 23 minutes and 48 seconds. He ran the final five miles in rain.

Connecticut school teacher Johnny Kelley, who acted as a "pacer" during Oksanen's two previous marathon wins, finished fourth, about five minutes behind Oksanen. Kelley holds the course record of 2:20:05.

Oksanen, a police detective, pounded across the finish line 300 yards ahead of Pystonen, a sergeant in the Finnish army, and nearly four minutes ahead of Marine Lt. Alex Breckenridge who came in third.

Oregon State University, Corvallis — One of Oregon State's all-time favorite football players, Joe Francis, will again lead the Beaver alums against the varsity in the 4th annual "spring game" on May 19, Athletic Director R. S. Keene announced today.

But this time the ex-tailback great will be limited to coaching and organizational duties because of a knee operation he underwent last winter. The leg is recovering nicely, but Francis was advised by doctors not to play on it yet.

Francis organized, coached and starred on the alumni team the last three years in thrilling performances. He was one of the key figures in the game becoming such a popular event.

Keene said that he and Francis would request San Francisco 49er star end Aaron Thomas to serve as field captain for the alumni squad. Thomas is at OSU completing work towards his degree, after a great rookie season with the 49ers last fall.

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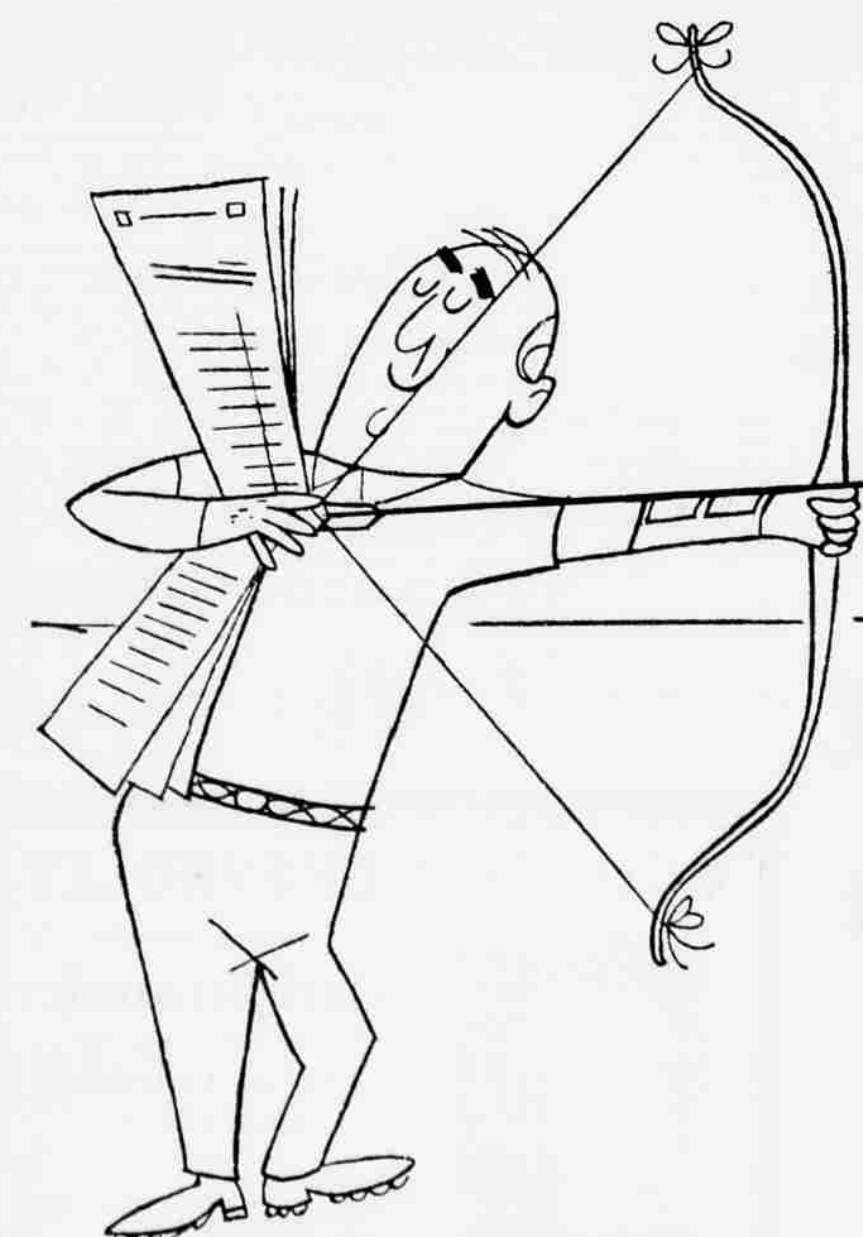
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
