

Grants Pass Outdistances Field In Record-Busting Rotary Meet

Grants Pass — Grants Pass high's track and field aggregation, bulging with depth and power, far outran the opposition here Saturday afternoon in the annual Rotary club meet.

And, Medford, finishing in second place in a contest featuring an array of record-busting efforts, was away in front of the rest of the field. The Cavenem of Coach Russ Werner amassed 234 1/2 points as they won eight of the 14 events, set two meet marks and tied another. Coach Dean Benson's Black Tornado had a 96.7/12 count in establishing three new Rotary records, as it took first in four events.

Hill Wins Three

Medford's Jim Hill garnered the day's individual honors by winning the 100 and 220-yard dashes in the blazing time of 9.9 and 22.2 and the broad jump with 210 feet 9 1/2 inches. His two sprint times were records.

The other Tornado record smasher was sophomore Steve Toews who ran the half-mile in 1:58.7. This time also eclipsed the Medford school mark of 1:59.1 set several years ago by Billie Lane.

Breaking standards for Grants Pass were Gil Smith with 19.7 in the low hurdles and Steve Ausland with 198-2 1/2 in the javelin. GP's Dennis O'Leary tied the high hurdles standard by taking that event in 14.0.

The other meet mark fell to Mike Cruncheon, Roseburg, who ran the mile in 4:32.

Other firsts for the Cavenem were Marty Bauer 51.7 in the shot put, Bob Shepard a measured six feet in the high jump, the relay team in 1:31.2, Gary Van Koten 12.9 in the pole vault and Mike Curtis 148-5 1/2 in the discus.

The other first place went to Barry Frantz, Rogue River, in the 440 run. Frantz, runner-up in state A-2 meet in the event last spring showed himself the top quarter-miler in the valley with 51.7.

A number of school records fell. Among them was the second place 1:59.4 second place

in the half by LeRoy Montgomery of GP.

A-2 school entrants did well, although the bulk of the laurels went to the big schools. Steve Geren set an Eagle Point school mark with his 52.4 third place in the quarter mile. Lew Whipple, placing fifth in the low hurdles

in 21.4 and tying for fifth in the high hurdles in 15.7 in the high, also wrote new Eagle marks.

Grants Pass gleaned points out of every event. The Cavenem were one, two, three in the low hurdles and javelin and one, two in the high hurdles, shot put and pole vault. They grabbed their lead early and just never were challenged.

Medford Coach Benson remarked that his Black Tornado showed improvement right down the line but still was outperformed.

Southern Oregon was slow in gathering steam in the first game. Only runs came in the fourth inning-two.

Ted Snapp got two hits for three times at bat and Dennis Tontoni got one for two for Humboldt. Southern Oregon's Jesse Munyon scored two for three to rank as top hitter for the first game.

The Red Raiders of Southern Oregon started out with one run in the first inning, got none in the second, scored one in the third and wound up with two in the seventh.

Paul Blinka, freshman from Grants Pass, put the game on ice for Southern Oregon by hitting a two-run homer in the top of the seventh. This brought in the third and fourth runs. The score was 2 to 1 up to the seventh.

In the third game, Southern Oregon came back and won 10 to 7. Slow to get underway again, the Raiders started accumulating runs in the fifth inning with one, then seven in the sixth and added two more in the seventh. Blinka also hit a homer in the fifth.
