

N.Y. Yankees Keep Jinx Over Cleveland Indians

The world champion New York Yankees maintained their jinx over the Cleveland Indians Saturday by beating them at Yankee Stadium for the 19th straight time, 3-1, on John Blanchard's three-run homer in the first inning.

Whitey Ford was credited with his first victory of the year after pitching a six-hitter for eight innings and then turning over the job in the ninth inning to Luis Arroyo. Bobby Richardson and Mickey Mantle were on base as a result of walks in the first when Blanchard connected against Barry Latham.

Gene Green hit a tremendous homer in the fifth inning for Cleveland's only run.

In other afternoon games in the American league, the Boston Red Sox edged the Detroit Tigers, 4-3; the Kansas City Athletics ruined Early Wynn's 1962 pitching debut by beating the Chicago White Sox, 9-6, and the Baltimore Orioles sent the Washington Senators down to their fifth straight defeat, 3-0.

The Los Angeles Angels played the Minnesota twins in a night game on the west coast.

The Red Sox staked pitcher Ed Swallow to four runs in the third inning and he was credited with his first victory of the season, although Dick Radatz pitched the ninth inning. Al Kaline and Norm Cash hit Detroit homers. Carl Yastrzemski hit a key double during Boston's four-run third-inning outburst against Frank Lary.

Norm Siebern and Jerry Lumpe each hit a two-run homer in the A's win over the White Sox. Wynn, making his first 1962 start in quest of his 29th major league pitching victory, retired for a pinch-hitter after yielding four runs in four innings. Al Smith hit a Chicago homer.

Johnny Temple drove in all three Baltimore runs with a single and a double against Washington's Claude Osteen. Art Quirk was the Baltimore winner, although Milt Stock relieved him in the sixth and yielded two hits during the last 3 2/3 innings.

Hanby vaulted 13-8 1/2 and Thomas owns a 6-3 1/2 high jump this season.

Four Portland State Vikings lead the events, including a double by Loren Remy in the shot and discus. Tom Cook heads the two millers and Steve Curtis has an impressive 218-11 1/2 toss of the javelin for PSC.

Lewis Thorne of Eastern Oregon has double bests in the hurdle events.

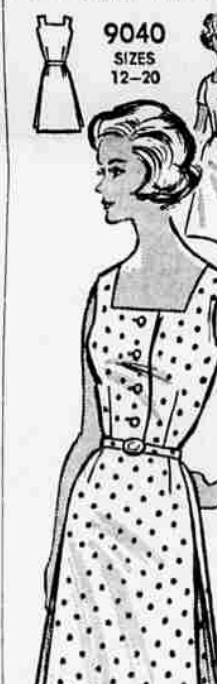

The Pittsburgh Pirates and St. Louis Cardinals preserved their undefeated records Saturday while the hapless New York Mets went down to their eighth consecutive defeat.

Pittsburgh moved to within one game of tying the modern major league record of 10 straight wins at the start of the season by beating the Mets, 8-4. The Cardinals made it seven in a row with an 8-0 romp over the Chicago Cubs.

In other afternoon games in the National league, the San Francisco Giants rallied to beat the Cincinnati Reds, 8-6, and the Los Angeles Dodgers whipped the Milwaukee Braves, 4-1.

Cal McLish, aided by Jack Baldschun's relief in the eighth and ninth innings, gained credit for the victory as the Philadelphia Phillies downed the Houston Colts, 3-1, in a night game before 21,821 fans at Houston. A triple by Tony Gonzalez and singles by Roy Sievers and Wes Covington were the big blows of the Phillies' attack.

Pittsburgh was out-hit by the Mets, 13 to 9, but Dick Stuart drove in four Pirate runs with a homer and bases-loaded single. The Mets left 14 men on the bases.

Bob Friend was credited with his third victory, although he had to leave the game in the seventh inning when struck on the right elbow by Ed Bouchee's line drive. Elroy Face relieved him and gave up two New York runs in the ninth.
