UPI Services Added to Three Evening Papers

San Francisco - (UPI) - The world-wide services of United Press International have been added to the Berkeley Gazette, the Palo Alto Times and the Costa Mesa Orange Coast Daily Pilot in California, Pacific Division Manager Richard A. Litfin has announced.

Addition of the UPI report to these three evening newspapers follows closely on installation of UPI news unit service at the morning Sacramento Union.

Litfin said the new subscribers reflect the steady growth and expansion of UPI in the Pacific Division, consisting of the 10 western states. In California, UPI now serves 126 of the 136 daily newspapers, he added.

The Berkeley Gazette, published by George B. Dunscomb, is receiving UPI news pictures in facsimile and will add full UPI news service in due course. The Palo Alto Times has added the UPI news report to its present service. The Times is published by Peninsula Newspapers, Inc., headed by George F. Morell, board chairman, and Eugene C. Bishop, president.

The Orange Coast Daily Pilot is published by the Orange Coast Publishing Company. The president is Walter Burroughs. He is currently vice president of Sigma Delta Chi and will become president of the national journalism fraternity in November.

Disabled Veterans Gel License Rate

With trout season now under way, Elmer W. Donahoo, Jackson county veterans service officer, reminded disabled war veterans they are entitled to special low cost fishing and hunting licenses.

Donahoo said state law provides that war veterans with disabilities of 25 per cent or more may purchase fishing licenses for 50 cents. The same rate applies for hunting licenses, and for \$1 the eligible veteran may obtain a combination hunting-fishing license. Residence in Oregon for the preceding year is required.

Applications must be made direct to the Oregon state game commission, 1634 SW Alder st., Portland. Application forms are available at the county service officer's office in the courthouse at Medford.

Eligible veterans were encouraged by Donahoo to apply immediately because several days time is involved in mailing and processing of the application by the game commission.
