## Dayton Senator Requests Probe of Hiring of Infante

Salem—State Sen. Carl Francis (R-Dayton) Monday called for a legislative investigation into the 1957 hiring of Mark M. Infante as a field representative for the Oregon Labor Bureau.

Infante left the bureau in 1960 after serving as an investigator of working conditions of migrant laborers in Oregon. Infante sparked heavy criticism at the time from farmers, who complained of his methods.

### Factor in Legislation

The survey that Infante helped take was a factor in passage of Oregon migrant labor legislation in 1959 and 1961.

Francis, in a letter to State Sen. Lloyd Key (D-Milton-Freewater) chairman of the Legislative Interim Agriculture committee, asked Key's committee to look into the hiring.

Francis said that during his employment, Infante "abused his authority" numerous times, putting farmers in a bad light.

It might be well for the legislature to "review the processes" of the State Civil Service Commission, Francis said, with corrective action taken, if necessary.

Francis said he would not be opposed to a new regulation whereby the Civil Service Commission would fingerprint certain applicants for a routine check of their backgrounds.

Francis told Key that the interim committee should determine whether Infante was a "proper person to have been employed by the state of Oregon," and if not, how did he come to be hired. When Infante left in 1960, he said it was for more pay at a new job in San Diego, Calif.

### No Plan to Rehire

Civil service records indicate that the Labor Bureau did not intend to ever rehire Infante.

Gov. Mark Hatfield has already begun an investigation of the hiring of Infante, at the request of the Oregon Farm Bureau.

Infante's name burst into the news last week when a man known as Marcantonio

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## New Forest Service Policy Applied in Waldo Lake Area

Washington (Special) - The Forest Service has revealed how its new high mountain timber policy will be applied in the first specific case to come up for decision - development of the Waldo Lake area in W. 111 lamette National Forest.

The new policy, enacted recently by the Secretary of Agriculture, Secretary Orville Freeman's approval, is designed to reserve certain scenic areas in the higher elevations of the national forests for recreation purposes.

Last year the Forest Service proposed a multiple-use management plan for the Waldo Lake area high in the Cascades east of Eugene. But some local citizens organized a protest against any logging in the area. Some wanted it preserved in its natural wild state. At the request of Sen. Wayne Morse, the multiple-use plan was pulled back for review by Secretary Freeman.

Upshot of these developments was that the new high mountain policy was worked out and a new plan for Waldo Lake developed to conform with that policy. The plan is a middle - of - the - road scheme somewhere between the two most prominent conflicting uses - logging and wilderness - for which there are vocal advocates.

Waldo Lake will not be a wilderness area, but neither will commercial logging be permitted in the immediate vicinity. A new access road will be constructed into the area for outdoor enthusiasts, but the road will approach the lake from a distance and never get close to the shoreline.

Recreation has been designated as the key value for the entire area . . . and activities will be geared to maintaining or improving recreation values," Forest Service Chief Ed Cliff stated.

Urges No Harvesting

In appealing the decision concerning the original multiple-use plan, a group headed by J. Michael McCloskey of Eugene urged that no timber harvesting be allowed within the Waldo Lake watershed. Cliff ruled as follows on that point:

"Under the plan, as well as the high mountain areas policies, timber harvesting is permissive under controlled specifications. The plan provides that timber will be managed to maintain a thrifty, healthy, continuous forest cover which precludes vast areas of stumps as envisioned by the appellants. Scenic and natural beauty will be preserved. In roadside, trailside and waterfront zones, a near-natural condition safe for human use will be maintained. In extensive undeveloped areas of the basin beyond the use areas, the stand will be managed to present a natural appearance from the lake. Slash treatment will be carried out in all areas and large openings will be avoided."

Under the original plan, the Forest Service proposed some clear cutting to achieve an orderly and well managed forest."

The road building plan did not materially change. The location is the same in both plans. The route of the main access road would take the visitor toward the east side of the lake. To reach the opposite side he would have to use foot trails, for that side is to be retained in near-natural state, Cliff said.

Access by Trail

"No road construction will be undertaken in recreation areas until recreation plans have been completed. Main roads will not be built close to any of the lakes. All access will be by trail or by stub or loop roads for best service to recreation facilities where they are called for in the recreation plans."

This area of the Cascades is a land of lakes - some 300 of them, ranging from a fraction of an acre in size to the big 600-acre Waldo lake. The shorelines are rocky, mostly, and ringed by alpine trees. Most of the larger lakes have fish, and fishing would be encouraged under the new plan. Hunting will also be allowed, possibly under special-ty designated seasons to keep wildlife populations within manageable proportions for the available forage.
