

Picketing Overshadows Probe of Un-American Subcommittee

Stocks Narrowly Mixed; Steels Dip Noticeably

New York — (UPI) — Stocks were narrowly mixed today with losses running to 2 points predominant among the steels.

Weakness in the steel group came although U.S. Steel, the nation's leading producer, showed a sizable profit for the first quarter and announced it would retain its regular quarterly dividend. Jones & Laughlin, U.S. Steel, Lukens, Universal Cylinders, and Republic lost 1 or more.

Auto held steady but chemicals weakened with Du Pont off roughly 1 1/4. Oils were narrowly mixed.

Electronics, cosmetics, metals, finance shares and tobacco softened.

RED CHINA CHARGES BORDER VIOLATIONS
Tokyo—(UPI)—Red China charged today that Indian troops violated its border on two separate occasions earlier this month and warned that "such activities may lead to grave consequences."

MACMILLAN UNABLE TO VISIT JAPAN
London—(UPI)—Prime Minister Harold Macmillan has informed the Japanese government that he will not be able to visit Japan this fall, a spokesman at the prime minister's office said today.

SPAIN GUARDS AGAINST TROUBLE IN MINER STRIKE
Madrid, Spain—(UPI)—Informed sources said today authorities have moved police reinforcements into this mining area to prevent possible trouble growing out of a strike by 18,000 coal miners here.

MENNEN WILLIAMS LEAVES FOR BANGUI
Yaounde, Cameroon Republic—(UPI)—U. S. Assistant Secretary of State G. Mennen Williams and his wife left here Monday for Bangui, capital of the Central African Republic. The Williams, who are on an African tour, were dinner guests of President Ahmadou Ahidjo before they left.

Minor Episode Only Incident In Los Angeles

Los Angeles — (UPI) — The first of four planned days of mass picketing against hearings of a House subcommittee on un-American activities has produced events and characters which have outwardly overshadowed the investigation itself.

But more important, it went off without any physical violence except for a minor episode involving a nonpicket on the sidewalks. He was arrested and held in lieu of \$250 bail on charges of slapping another spectator.

Aim Accomplished
The volunteer cast of hundreds outside the Federal Building accomplished its apparent aim of stealing the show from the subcommittee — whose four members heard three witnesses in tightly guarded seclusion on the fifth floor.

The anticommunist groups involved hoped to master additional support today through demonstrations they have said are scheduled on several college campuses around the nation and outside the New York and San Francisco city halls.

The picketing groups here turned out fewer persons on Tuesday than their leaders had predicted. Police Inspector Ed Walker estimated the maximum number at from 600 to 800 before noon. But through most of the day, the total was far short of this even though picket leaders had forecast up to 2,000 marchers.

Chairman Clyde Doyle (D-Calif.) and the other subcommittee members, were about the only persons maintaining public silence on the opening day of hearings.

Ben Dobbs, an avowed spokesman for the Communist party in Southern California, told newsmen he invoked the Fifth Amendment in refusing to answer questions about his associations and various documents. He was one of the first witnesses.

John Despol, administrator of Steelworkers Union Local 2058, who also testified, told reporters he "answered all questions." He was understood to have been queried about 12 union members employed at the Maywood, Calif., plant of the Consolidated Western Steel Co.

The local was placed under Despol's trusteeship by the international union because of charges and countercharges of communism and John Birch Society advocacy in its ranks. Despol, known as an anti-Communist, said he urged the committee to investigate the John Birch Society as well as alleged Reds.

U.S. 'Shares Regret' About Nuclear Testing

Washington — (UPI) — The United States said today it "shares the regret that many governments and peoples feel" about the U.S. resumption of nuclear testing in the atmosphere.

But a State department spokesman said the test series that started in the mid-Pacific and workable test ban treaty today was vital to Free World security.

Those who oppose the U.S. tests "should never lose sight of the fact" that President Kennedy agreed "not to test if the Soviet government would agree to conclude an effective and in the absence of an effective treaty to halt such tests."

Department Press Officer Lincoln White said.

White said the "decision to test was taken reluctantly and with awareness of our responsibility as the most powerful defender of the Free World and in the absence of an effective treaty to halt such tests."

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
