

Humboldt Nudges Raider Cindermen

Arcata, Calif. — Humboldt State came from four points behind in the final event to upset previously undefeated Southern Oregon, 66-65, in a thrilling dual meet marred by 40 degree weather here Tuesday night.

It was the first loss handed the Red Raiders in six outings this year, despite the fact that the Ashlanders set two new school records, tied two others and cracked six meet standards.

Southern Oregon led 65-61 going in the last event, the mile relay, but the Lumberjacks won in record time to squeeze out their slim, one-point decision.

Distance ace Jerry Arndt claimed both new SOC records as he finished second in both the mile and two mile.

Podoloff, now 71, announced his retirement plans Tuesday night at the annual meeting of the NBA's board of governors. He has served as president of the pro basketball league since its inception in 1946.

"There are a great many things I want to do and I will now have the opportunity to realize some of my unfulfilled desires," Podoloff told the NBA owners. "And having passed the proverbial 3 score and 10, the years are getting shorter."

The parents, Mr. and Mrs. Alfred Moss, visited the London hospital where Moss is still unconscious from his injuries. A hospital bulletin said Tuesday night "There seems good hope for Moss' recovery."

"I hope that he will definitely give up racing," said the elder Moss at his son's bedside. "He may have to because of his injuries."

"I would like for Stirling to stop after this," echoed Mrs. Moss.

Moss was at the Atkinson Morley Brain hospital at Wimbledon, where he was taken early Tuesday after crashing at 120 miles an hour at the Easter Monday race meeting at the Goodwood racing circuit.
