**Somebody Should Tell the
Snakes About 'Snake Run'**
We practically forgot there
was supposed to be such a
thing until an old woodsman
the other day assured us there
was a peculiar "runway" at
the edge of his property.

He knew its exact width
and could guess at its probable
length. He said, too, that it
had been in use for more years
than he had any recollection.
A "snake-run" he called it,
and he had neighbors who had
lived in the area for many
years and they, too, agreed
that it was an "invisible high-
way" over which countless
generations of snakes had reg-
ularly traveled since the very
beginning of time.

100 Yards Wide

The "snake-run" bordered
his property, and was reported
to be about 100 yards wide
and no one knew how long, or
where it went or where it
started. Although we gave the
area a good going over, no
snakes nor signs of snakes
could be found. He explained
the reason for the absence of
evidence. He figured the
snakes "are just smart enough
not to leave any trail; they
want to keep the 'run' a se-
cret."

He also claimed that snakes
had been seen moving back
and forth every year as long
as any resident of the neigh-
borhood could remember.

Snakes, like animals of a
nobler class, must have ade-
quate amounts of water to
drink, and in times of short-
age they would naturally
move toward the nearest sup-
ply.

If such a move became nec-
essary, they would follow any
path that afforded ample
cover or protection. This so-
called "snake-run" was an
area overgrown with weeds
and low bushes. It would be
the natural place for any cre-
ature to travel secretly.

Beyond Capability
However, thinking the
snakes would follow an an-
cestral path, instinctively fol-
lowing a trail their ancestors had
blazed centuries before, is
more than a little ridiculous,
and considerably beyond any
snake's capability.

There would be, of course,
a migration of sorts in snake-
dom, dictated by changes in
temperature. But at such
times the animals would move
over the shortest possible route,
and probably as individuals
rather than as a group.

To "hole up" for the winter
in some rockpile would be a

migration of some duration.
No mass movement of snakes
has been recorded. They fol-
low no visible or invisible
highway. Where one snake or
a dozen went last year or the
year before—if there was such
a movement, which is a little
doubtful—has been pretty
well ignored by scientific ob-
servations.

**Chamber Warns Residents
Of Septic Tank Additives**

The Medford Chamber of
Commerce has advised against
the use of commercially pre-
pared bacterial and enzymatic
additives for septic tanks and
cesspools.

"These additives are of lit-
tle or no use and some are
definitely harmful," said Don
McNeil, chamber manager,
"yet dozens of firms continue
to advertise them as pan-
aceas for ending septic tank
and cesspool troubles."

According to the U.S. Pub-
lic Health service, none of
the 1,200 bacterial products
placed on the market for use
in septic tanks has ever pro-
ved to be of advantage in prop-
erly controlled tests. McNeil
said.

Maintains Flow
The chamber manager
made it clear, however, that
his criticism was not directed
at all kinds of additives. He
explained that there are three
kinds of such additives: cas-
tics, such as those containing
sodium hydroxide; those con-
taining bacteria and/or en-
zymes; and those with chemi-
cals designed to further the
porosity in the drainage field.
