Many Extension Members To Attend State Session

Fifty-two home extension unit members of the county will attend the 30th annual meeting of the Oregon Home Economics Extension Council on the Oregon State university campus on May 1, 2 and 3. Miss Joan Beasley, Jackson county home extension agent, will also attend.

The theme of the meeting is "Home — the Foundation of Citizenship." At the Tuesday evening banquet homes in other lands will be featured. International farm youth exchanges and exchange delegates will talk about the countries they have visited and represent.

Scholarships will be presented at the Wednesday luncheon; one of them will be the Ethel K. Lathrop scholarship. Mrs. Lathrop, a long-time Jackson county resident, helped organize the State Extension Council and was one of the early state presidents.

Mrs. Glen V. Allen of Medford is on the State Extension Council executive board as a representative of Jackson, Josephine and Klamath counties.

This year she has been asked to be a leader in a workshop on publicity.

An Oregon homemaker also will be named for an expense paid trip to the Associated Country Women of the World conference in Australia this October. Mrs. Riddell Lage, Hood River, president of OHEEC, will preside at the conference.

More than 21,000 homemakers regularly participated in organized extension family interest groups in Oregon last year. County agents taught home economics skills and women interest subjects to 18,893 volunteer project leaders, who in turn, taught this information to another 84,600 women.

About 700 women are expected at the state-wide sessions.

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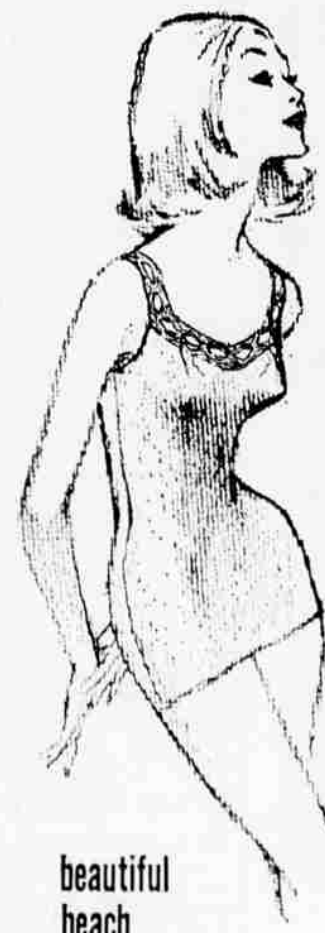
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
