Farm Prices Dip, Costs Increased To Record High

Washington—UPI—Farm prices declined nearly 1 per cent and farm costs rose one third of 1 per cent in a record high in the month ending April 15, the Agriculture Department has reported.

The decline in prices received stemmed from lower returns for milk, oranges, lettuce, hogs, eggs, and chickens. Slight increases for cotton, apples, corn and wheat were not enough to prevent an over-all decline.

Amortization Change Promised

Washington—Sen. Wayne Morse (D-Ore.) has announced that Secretary Orville Freeman has advised him that the Forest Service intends to make a basic change in policy regarding the amortization of roads constructed by timber purchasers.

In January, Senator Morse requested that the Forest Service revise its procedures so as to reduce the working capital requirements of firms purchasing national forest timber when the sale involved extensive road construction. The Morse proposal would reduce the price of timber until the road was built and pick up the reduction in the latter part of the sale.

Secretary Freeman has agreed to the proposal. "The Oregon Democrat said: 'I am extremely pleased that Secretary Freeman has adopted the suggestion. When I first offered the idea, some in the Forest Service were not enthusiastic, although a somewhat similar program has been in effect for the last several years. I asked the Secretary to re-analyze the situation and he has done so. The new plan will be of significant benefit to the western lumber industry as it endeavors to meet competition from Canadian lumber.'"

The index of prices paid by farmers was a record 306 per cent of the base period. The index was 305 per cent in mid-March and mid-February, and 302 per cent in mid-April last year.

Average hog prices for the month at \$15.40 per hundredweight were off 60 cents from mid-March, 90 cents from February and \$1.40 from mid-April last year.

Average cattle prices for the month at \$21.10 per hundredweight were down 10 cents from mid-March but up 60 cents from mid-April a year ago.

Small Worlds Around Us

When creatures hurry. They have good reason. Some creatures fly fairly fast, and for good reason. Take for example the dragonfly: It may attain a speed of 60 m.p.h., but only because it is attempting to cover as much air space as possible in a search for more flying insects on which to feed. And speed helps save its life when pursued by some other predator.

Why these lowly creatures should fly, crawl or run so fast is because they have so little time. For them, time really is of the essence. But none of them really try to save time; that is something they know nothing about. All they are interested in is saving their own lives or securing food to sustain themselves.

They Hurry

The bird-pair may hurry a little in selecting and constructing a nest. Naturally they are anxious to start housekeeping at the earliest possible moment. Then, when the nest is built and the eggs are produced, comes the time of quiet, an interval when they couldn't hurry if they wanted to. It is a time of contemplation and patience. The female incubates the eggs in perfect calm.

When the baby birds cast off their limy shells, the parent birds suddenly become conscious of time. They forget

the quiet days, they fume and fuss, they become feathered dynamos of activity. They hurry to feed the baby birds, try to hurry them from the nest, rush the flying lessons.

By some bird-reasoning, they know this is the time of great danger. The quicker the young can be out on their own the better will be their chances of survival.

Looks for Short Cuts

Unlike the wild things that have no conscious conception of time-saving, the human animal searches constantly for short cuts and increased speed in all his acts. He hurries everything so that he can save a little time. He builds faster planes, rushes across oceans and continents, and boasts of the time he is saving.

He attempts to travel fast because in so doing he believes he saves time. He hurries only to break a record. He hurries not because something is after him, but because he is after that elusive thing called time.
