Peace Corps Explained By Speaker

Dr. Betty Lou Dunlop, faculty member from Southern Oregon college, explained the Peace Corps at the last meeting of Epsilon chapter, Delta Kappa Gamma, international honor society for women teachers. It was held in Girls Community Club, Medford, and the president, Miss Gladys Owen, conducted a business session.

Dr. Dunlop described the Peace Corps as an experiment in international cooperation begun in February 1961 under the sponsorship of the Department of State. Over 600 volunteers are already working in the program, she stated, and added that by June it is thought more than three times this number will be involved.

The speaker said that volunteers should be within the 21 to 45 age group, and must be able to undertake arduous tests, training and living. They must be able to live a pioneer life and willing to live according to the standards of the people with whom they work.

Projects depend on the country and its needs. Dr. Dunlop explained, "It concerns education, it was said that some countries need emphasis on secondary education, others need help in preparing elementary teachers. Medicine, food production and road building are other projects."

Countries are asking for more corps members, the speaker said.

Dr. Dunlop's address was in keeping with the program theme of the group for the year which is "Developing Human Resources."

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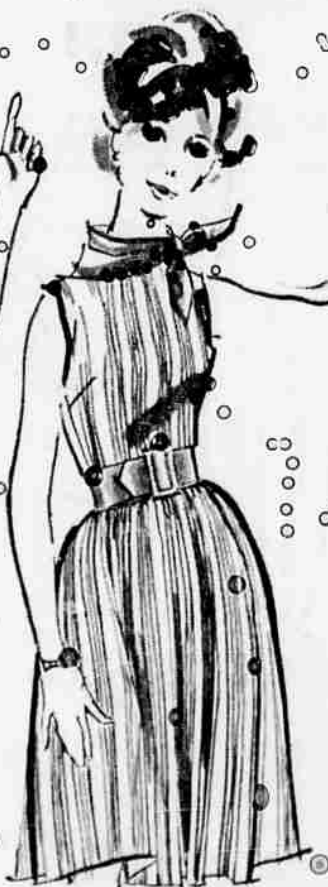


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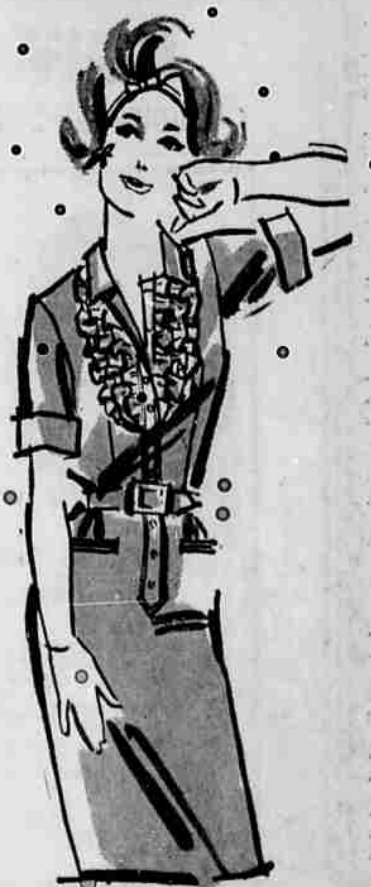


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
