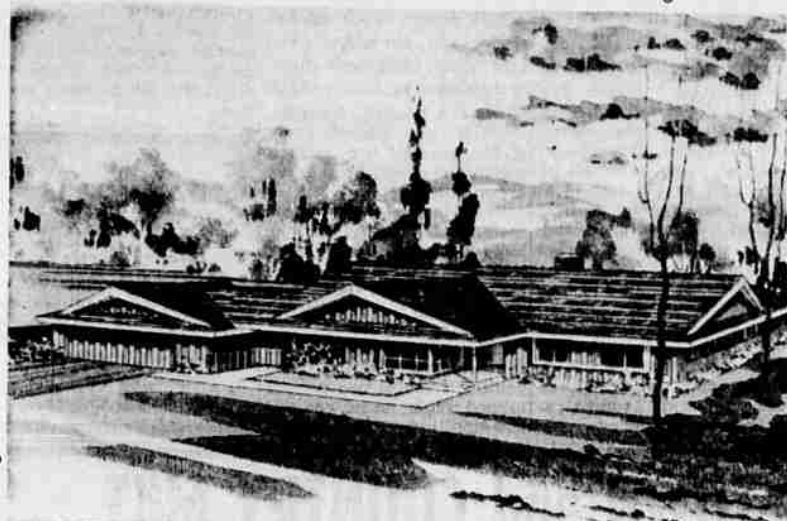




Birch Head Sees Red Control of U. S. by 1972.

Brunswick, Maine — UPI — Robert W. Welch, founder of the John Birch Society, Wednesday night contended that the United States might be under Communist control by 1972.

Welch told a Bowdoin college political forum that "as we move toward 1972 there will be a loss of freedom." "We'll see the full scourge of brutal Communist control over our country by 1972, if not before," the former Belmont, Mass., candy maker told a capacity crowd of 700 students, newsmen and townspeople.

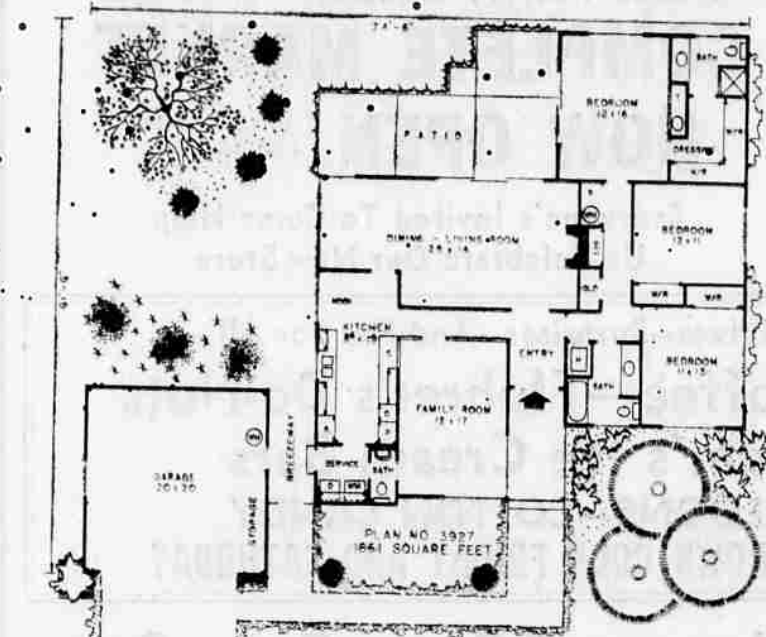
Welch said he could see nothing on the horizon that would "change the course of this action."

Not a Prediction

In his 80-minute talk, Welch said he was not predicting that the Communist take-over would come to pass but said "there are clear indications from past history" that it will. "There has been no investigation of Communist infiltration in government since 1956," he said. "Communists in government are climbing faster and higher than ever."

The Bowdoin political issues committee attacked Welch's appearance by distributing pamphlets to persons as they entered Packard theater to hear the speech.

The group said "It would be a mistake to consider the appearance of Welch at Bowdoin as an endorsement of the John Birch Society."



This Week's Ranch and Modern Home

Any discriminating homeowner who will take the time to thoroughly study this plan will discover a wealth of design interest, both inside and outside the home. All of these imaginative ideas — some new, some old — guarantee any family gracious and luxurious living.

A wide roof overhang around most of the house shades the interior from direct sunlight and protects the windows during rains. The gable roof helps make the design look even larger than its 1861 square feet. If preferred, the cedar shake roof could be changed to rock during construction.

Stone in Planter

Stone has been used in the planter at the corner of the garage and again in a planter next to the breezeway. Aluminum windows and board on board vertical siding complete the front elevation of this contemporary design which will be as smart and modern tomorrow as it is today.

A covered porch protects the double doors at the wide entry. Notice how good the circulation pattern is in this center hall plan.

The generous size living room and dining ell are at the rear of the house. There is something wonderfully special about the warm glow of a wood burning fireplace. This one has been located so as to take as little space as possible from the living room and to make the arranging of furniture easier. The sliding glass doors opening to the

patio offer the modern family a sheltering haven indoors — plus a good share in the outside world.

Separated from Hall

The family room is separated from the hall — and part of the kitchen — by a partial wall which defines the size of the room but makes it appear even larger by not limiting your line of vision.

The kitchen is conveniently located between the family room and dining ell and close to the attached garage. In addition to its ample size, other features are the nook area, built-ins and pantry. A half-bath is accessible from both the service and the family room.

The elegant master bedroom suite has sliding doors opening to the patio plus a shoulder high window for cross ventilation and to facilitate the arranging of furniture. There is a private dressing area and bath. Another lavatory plus a dressing table opens to the bedroom but is hidden from view with folding doors.

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Auto Manufacturers Report Earnings

Detroit — UPI — The five big automobile manufacturers first made \$509 million in the first three months of this year, 114 per cent more than the \$238 million profit in the same period of 1961.

Ford Motor Co., the last to report first quarter figures, said Wednesday it earned \$127.7 million in the period up from \$76 million a year ago.

General Motors made \$374 million, more than double all the other firms combined. During the first quarter in 1961, GM earned \$188 million.

American Motors' net income was \$8,850,200, compared with \$2,208,284 for the three months in 1961. Chrysler earned \$1.3 million, against a \$21.9 million loss last year.

Studebaker lost \$2.6 million, compared with a \$6,493,000 deficit in the same period a year ago.
