

GP Nursing Home Files Complaint Against New State Fire Code

Salem — (UPI) — State Fire Marshal Walter Korlann has received a third formal complaint and hearing request from a medical institution about Oregon's new and stiffer fire code.

The latest complaint is from Parkview Nursing Home, Grants Pass. The home says

it was certified in the past but now has been told to install fire curtains and make other improvements. A date for a hearing will be set later.

Korlann announced a change in the hearing date on complaints by Klamath Valley and Hillsdale hospitals, both of

Governors Against Reducing Strength Of National Guard

Anchorage, Alaska — (UPI) — The Western Governors' conference has gone on record opposing reduction of Army National Guard strength and urging that any reorganization of the National Guard be delayed until similar action is taken with active Army and Air National Guard.

It was one of 13 resolutions adopted by the governors at the closing business session last week.

The governors also elected Gov. Paul Fannin of Arizona as their 1963 chairman and Gov. Edmund G. (Pat) Brown of California as vice chairman. Date and site of the 1963

conference will be announced later.

The governors also urged all states to ratify a proposed interstate vehicle equipment safety compact "to accelerate efforts to develop and adopt uniform standards for improved automobile safety equipment."

A second interstate highway compact adopted by the governors suggested a seven-point program to assure greater automobile traffic safety in the nation. The resolution will be introduced at the national governors' meeting this summer in Hershey, Pa., to seek national implementation of the program.

They have 180 days from the April 23 order in which to comply.

The hearing will be in Korlann's office here in the State Labor and Industries building at 9 a.m. (PST) Wednesday. A May 11 hearing date was canceled, as was a Tuesday date.

There have also been two informal complaints — both from homes for the aged in Portland — but these have been settled.

The fuss stems from a March 23 opinion by Atty. Gen. Robert Y. Thornton that the fire code passed by the 1961 Legislature applies not only to new hospitals, nursing homes and homes for the aged but older ones as well.

Six Months To Comply

The new code went into effect Jan. 1, 1962, and all institutions must be certified by the state by June 30. The fire marshal inspects all facilities and certifies their safety to the State Board of Health, which in turn certifies them for operation.

Korlann revealed he has asked the attorney general for another opinion — on whether the fire marshal can certify

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Explosive Fire Damages Prineville Editor's Home

Prineville — (UPI) — An explosive fire that police said was set did extensive damage Friday night to the home of Central Oregonian editor Ron Swift, who has been receiving threats over water fluoridation.

The flash fire blew out windows in the living room and bedroom. Police said an explosive substance, such as gas and oil, had been poured around the house.

Swift, who is 25 and became editor of the newspaper earlier this year, has received threats during the past month over his paper's publication of information about a ballot measure to fluoridate the water supply. The proposal goes before the voters May 18.

On April 28, Swift called the fire department when he saw a roll of paper burning in the spout of the gas tank of his car. The following morning a similar newspaper bomb was found in an old car sitting on a lot about 12 feet from his home.

The next day the newspaper received an anonymous card with pasted out words reading: "More cars if poison goes in water."

Infante Acquitted Of Theft Charge

Los Angeles — (UPI) — Marcantonio Diaz-Infante, self-styled Mexican revolutionary leader, has been found innocent of a charge of bilking a woman of \$1,000 in 1950.

But Diaz-Infante, 39, was returned to county jail after the jury returned the verdict on the grand theft charge. He is awaiting a hearing on a charge of violating probation on a grand theft conviction in 1947.

The jury of eight women and four men deliberated less than two hours before finding Diaz-Infante innocent of a charge of taking \$1,000 from Mrs. Ysidra Chavez to obtain papers for immigration purposes.

Diaz-Infante claimed to be a leader of a 100,000-man revolutionary movement attempting to save Mexico from communism. A six-man delegation of the "Zapata Movement" appeared before the United Nations April 17, demanding an inquiry into current government activities of President Lopez Mateos.

The defendant denied ever receiving money from Mrs. Chavez.

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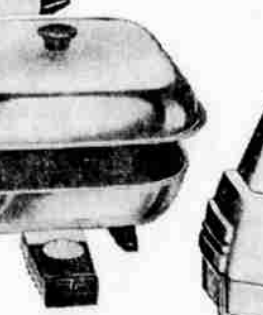




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
