His first job with a big-name band was as saxophonist in the Gene Krupa band, and jobs with Harry James and Benny Goodman followed. Shortly before the war, Mr. Donahue organized his own band.

Upon joining the navy he helped Artie Shaw organize a navy band. He served as co-organizer and arranger, saxophonist and assistant leader as they toured the South Pacific for almost two years, and when Mr. Shaw was discharged, Mr. Donahue led the band for more than a year as they toured the European theater.
