

Council Gives Tentative Approval to Young Musicians to Play

The Medford city council Thursday night gave tentative approval to Robert Adler, manager of a group of musicians called the Corvairs, to hold a dance Friday, May 11, at the Medford American Legion hall.

Since Adler and the group of musicians he represents are all under 21 years of age, several of the councilmen were reluctant to give outright approval to the request.

Councilman Donald Hansen moved approval with the stipulation that a member of the American Legion contact City Manager Robert Duff and offer himself as a sponsor for the dance. The council agreed to that proposal.

"You sort of have approval," Mayor John Snider told the young man with a smile.

Dale Truax, president of the student body at Southern Oregon college, asked the

council for permission to operate a sound truck in Medford to promote the appearance of the Limelighters, a vocal trio, in Medford May 18.

Councilman William Singler told the SOC student that while he was sympathetic with this particular endeavor, it had been the consistent policy of the council for several years to deny such requests. A unanimous negative vote followed.

Three public hearings were held. The council voted to amend a city ordinance to permit construction and operation of small animal hospitals in commercial zones; to grant a change of zone from single-family to multiple-family for a piece of property located on Crater Lake ave., to permit the construction of the proposed Sacred Heart hospital; and to author-

ize the paving of Withington st. from Hamilton to Plum sts. Bids were called for on the paving project.

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at a point two feet from the building foundation.

Action was postponed until the next meeting on a request by John L. Gregory for permission to erect an 8-foot fence on three lots on East McAndrews rd. in the College Hill subdivision.

Deny Appeal
The council voted to deny an appeal from Mrs. C. B. Evans, 401 North Keeneway dr., who objected to a negative ruling by the planning commission on her request for a variance to front yard set back requirements.

The Medford code was amended by the council to delete the provision requiring that the main water shutoff valve to a building be located

Plans and specifications were approved and a public hearing was set for May 17 on a project to pave Olwell Way from Jackson st. south 233 feet.

A project to pave Velia st., which had been continued from the previous council meeting, was held up when a property owner, James Poole, protested to the council that he, and a majority of the other property owners on the street, no longer supported the improvement.

The council, on motion by Councilman Donald Hansen, voted to call for a new public

hearing May 17 in connection with the matter.

A recommendation by the city manager's traffic committee that Oakdale ave. from Fourth st. to Stewart ave. be designated as arterial street was approved by the council.
