Construction Shutdown Nears

San Francisco — (UPI) — Northern California's construction industry faced the possibility of a complete shutdown today because of deadlocked negotiations between contractors and four laboring groups.

The Northern California Construction Employers association offered a new package proposal Wednesday to the 35,000-member Laborers Union, but the offer was rejected as "completely unrealistic."

Laborers have walked off \$370 million work of key construction jobs in 46 Northern California counties in the past 10 days, idling about 12,000 workers. Their contract expired May 1.

The contracts of three other unions — carpenters, cement masons and construction team-

sters — expired at the same time. These three unions have been observing laborers picket lines, but have not called walkouts of their own.

Contractors have threatened to close down the entire \$3.5 billion industry, on grounds that a strike against one is a strike against all, unless an agreement is reached.

Glenn Participates In Space Meeting

Seattle — (UPI) — John Glenn Jr., America's first orbital astronaut, arrived here Wednesday night to participate in the National conference on the Peaceful Use of Space.

Glenn was to take part in a panel discussion at the conference, now in its second day at the Opera House on the Seattle World's Fair Grounds.

When he arrived at Seattle-Tacoma airport, Glenn said at a short news conference he was convinced Russian cosmonaut Gherman Titov actually did orbit the earth as the Soviets claim.

"I have no proof one way or the other," Glenn said, "but if they say so I believe it."

Store at Brookings Destroyed by Flames

Brookings — (UPI) — Fire destroyed a variety store here Wednesday. Damage was estimated at \$60,000.

Cause of the blaze was under investigation.

Murray Palmer, owner of the store, said the blaze started in the dry goods section of the building.

Appling, Thompson Differ on Prediction

Salem — (UPI) — Secretary of State Howell Appling Jr. Wednesday predicted that only between 60 and 65 per cent of Oregon's registered voters would turn out for the May 18 primary election. Oregon has 854,102 registered voters.

But State Elections Director Jack Thompson predicted a turnout of about 80 per cent.

Redmond Tot Dies From Burgs in Tub

Redmond — (UPI) — An 8-month-old girl died and her 2-year-old sister suffered severe burns today while they were in a bathtub.

The victim was Carol Ann Miller, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. James Miller. The older sister, Diana Lynn, suffered burns on her legs. The family said the older girl accidentally turned hot water into the tub.

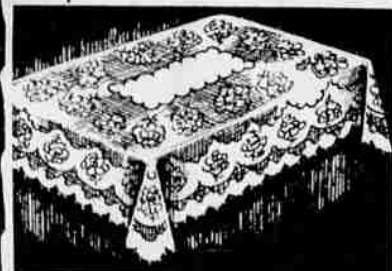
