Woman Attacked At Prineville

Prineville — (UP) — A man entered the home of a Prineville school teacher Wednesday and ripped the blouse of his wife before her screams caused him to flee, police reported.

Mrs. Duane Altig said she was cleaning house when she became aware of a draft and turned to face the man. She said he grabbed at her blouse and ripped it and then left by a door which police said had been forced.

Her husband is a member of the Junior Chamber of Commerce, which has been campaigning for fluoridation of the city's water supply.

Police said they were investigating to determine if the incident might have any connection with one last Friday night here in which the home of Ron Swift, editor of the Central Oregonian, was partially destroyed by fire.

Mrs. Altig was able to give only a sketchy description of the man who she said was in his 30s. She was not hurt.

Veneer Most Durable Of Furniture Woods

Brookings, S.D. — (UP) — Modern miracle adhesives and electronic presses insure against cracking or peeling and make the veneer of today the most durable of furniture woods. Roy Herold, associate professor of industrial arts education at South Dakota State college reports.

A veneer is a thin top layer of carefully matched, expensive wood on a piece of strong plywood or cork. The plywood is made by glueing together, under heavy pressure, several thicknesses of wood with the grain of alternate layers running at right angles to each other.
