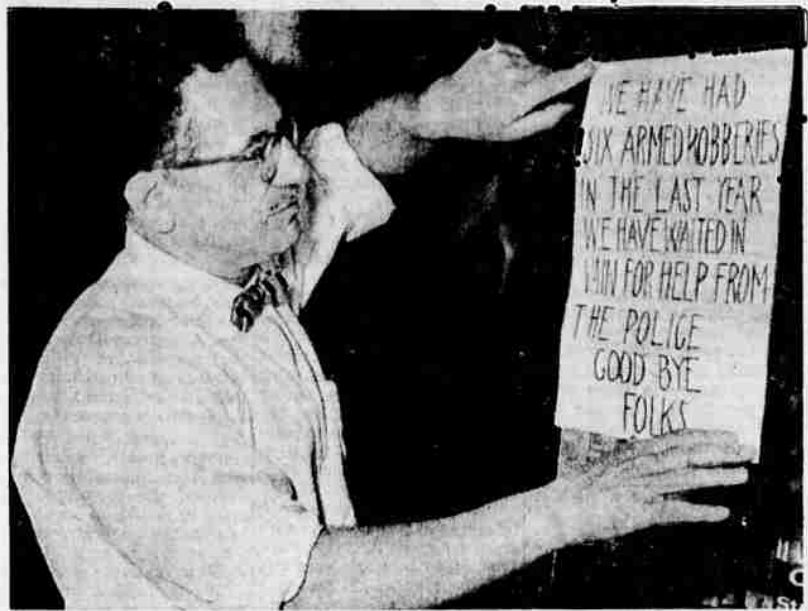

Sawmill Workers Set Negotiations

Portland—(UPI)—The Lumber and Sawmill Workers Union and Timber Operators Council, an employer group, will hold a preliminary wage negotiation meeting here May 14, it was announced today.

Karl Glos, executive secretary of the employer group, said the request for the meeting contained nothing specific in the way of wage demands. The International Woodworkers of America earlier asked for wage hikes of 30 cents an hour. Contracts with both unions reopen for wages only June 1.

Improvement Needed For Child Services

The point is made in a special issue of "Children," a journal published by the Children's Bureau, United States Department of Health, Education and Welfare.

Straub Calls for Better Management

"Improved management of the 650,000 acres of state owned lands could supply a great number of summertime jobs for boys of high school age," State Senator Robert W. Straub told the state interim committee on natural resources this week.

In a letter to the chairman, Representative Clinton Haight Jr., Straub said "the pilot program in Lane county last summer demonstrated that boys of high school age 15, 16, and 17, are both willing and capable of doing a man's job during the summer months if they get an opportunity."

In Oakland recently, Straub said "to be a friend and a strong right arm in Congress for the Forest Service, the Bureau of Land Management and the Corps of Engineers is one of the primary responsibilities of your Congressman."

Straub is a Democratic candidate for Congress in the fourth district and spoke to the IWA labor group.

He emphasized the key significance of increased access roads which would permit increased salvage sales of dead and dying timber. Straub said that he agrees with the fight that Senator Morse has been making in the Senate to increase federal appropriations for access roads and would work to support this effort in the House.

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Communists Entice Students Who Fail In West Germany

Bonn—(UPI)—East Germany is recruiting converts among Asian and African students who fail to pass their examinations in West German schools.

The Communist recruiting drive is getting into high gear just as the time West German educators are considering raising entrance requirements and passing marks for colored students.

In just a year, the Communists have managed to entice about 200 colored students away from West German schools, which had about 21,000 foreign students, most of them from Asia and Africa, at the beginning of 1962.

The contest for colored students is one more level at which the struggle for supremacy in Germany is carried on. So far, West Germany is well ahead on points. But the East German recruitment may rise in the near future as the West German school administrators act to prevent overcrowding and lowering of educational standards in their own establishments.

Students leaving the Asian and African secondary schools rarely have reached the levels of their West European or American counterparts.

Thousands of such students nevertheless are clamoring to get into European technical high schools and universities. They want to become doctors, engineers and lawyers.

Of the 21,000 foreign students now enrolled in German technical high schools and universities, it is estimated only 4,000 will graduate.

Heinrich Pfeiffer, manager of the Alexander von Humboldt Foundation which finances research by foreign scientists, recently suggested a national standard for language and other qualifications which foreign students would have to meet to gain admission to any West German institution, and perhaps a tutoring system for those unable to meet the standards.

He also proposed that foreign medical students receive their degrees only after they have served a two-year internship either here or abroad.

"Much misunderstanding has arisen," Pfeiffer explained, "because medical students graduated from a German university return to their homelands claiming that they are full-fledged doctors, but are unable to deal properly with the practical problems facing them. In the way, the reputation of German medicine has not rarely been damaged abroad."

Most of the agents of East Germany's Communist regime sowing their seed among the thousands who fail their examinations in West Germany are Asian and African students already enrolled in East German schools. One source says that at least one such agent is at work at each West German university.

The recruiting agents argue Asians and Africans fail to pass examinations in West German schools only because they are colored.

"In East Germany," one was quoted as promising, "none of us are failed. All get their diplomas."
