Oceanlake, Ore. — (UPI) — Oregon Young Republicans passed a resolution endorsing President Kennedy's Alliance for Progress program for Latin America here during the week end.

The Young Republicans also passed a resolution urging Congress to renege and abolish the House Un-American Activities Committee.

The group, in addition, approved a resolution against pre-primary endorsements.

Jim McReight, a 19-year-old sophomore political science major at Portland State college, was elected chairman of the state organization.

Mental Health Film Scheduled Wednesday

A film dealing with mental and emotional illness and entitled "You Are Not Alone" is scheduled to be shown on channel 10, KMED-TV Wednesday, May 16, at 4:30 p.m., according to Dr. John McLaughlin, president of the Jackson County Mental Health association.

The half-hour drama is being shown throughout the country in observance of Mental Health month and tells of a junior executive who becomes emotionally disturbed.

Red Cross Campaign Cochairman Picked

Seattle — (UPI) — James A. Linsen, president of Time, Inc., has accepted appointment as volunteer cochairman of the 1962 Red Cross campaign for members and funds, the 37th National Red Cross convention was advised here Monday.

Linsen will serve on the national campaign team with Fred A. Bantz, former undersecretary of the Navy who also was cochairman for the 1962 campaign.

Linsen's appointment was announced by E. Roland Harriman, volunteer national chairman of the American Red Cross. Harriman said the 1962 fund raising campaign would net \$86.6 million, a substantial gain over 1961.

Approximately 4,000 delegates, including some from other nations came here for the three-day convention.

Hanford Atomic Plant Costs Zoom

Washington — (UPI) — The cost of the Hanford, Wash., atomic energy plant has zoomed from an estimated \$145 million to \$195 million, it was disclosed Monday.

The disclosure came as the administration introduced its bill to authorize \$158,115,000 for Atomic Energy Commission projects. The bill includes a provision that would increase the cost of the Hanford reactor by \$50 million.

A spokesman for the Joint Atomic Energy Committee said costs of the reactor have gone up because of difficulties in construction. He said the money is not earmarked for a steam plant that generated a hot congressional battle last year.

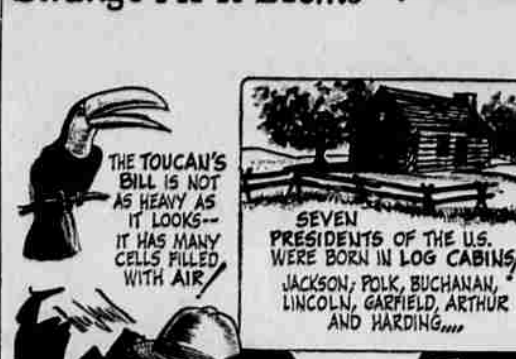

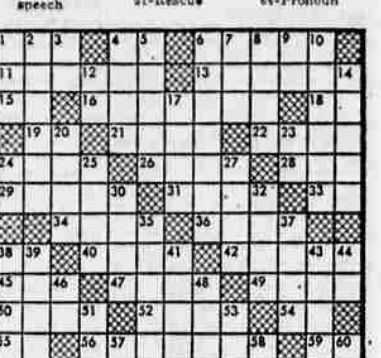
