Sixty-four little singers, Mrs. Cecil directing, gave the Oregon State Song, included

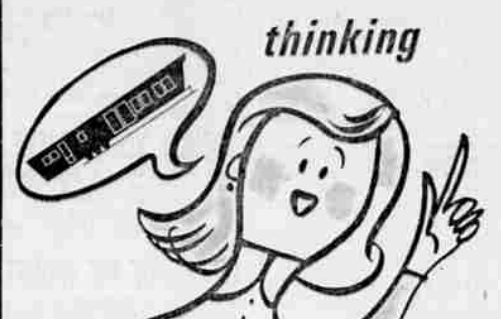
ments of thanks from the director. "I was glad she did that," Canaday said, "it made us all feel as if we had taken part."
