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Infante Degree Apparently Phony

Salem, Ore.—The executive secretary of an interim committee of the Oregon Legislature said late Tuesday he checked and found that a doctorate degree claimed by former Oregon labor bureau official Mark M. Infante apparently is phony.

Elsewhere, Infante is known as Marcantonio Diaz-Infante, self declared Mexican revolutionary.

Infante was an inspector for Oregon's labor bureau from 1957 to 1960 and stirred up Oregon farmers with what they called prejudiced reports on living conditions of migrant workers in Oregon.

Cecil Edwards of Salem, secretary of the Interim Agriculture Committee, released a letter to him from Prof. Felipe Garcia Beraza of the University of Mexico, where Infante claimed he had a doctorate in laws degree.

Beraza told Edwards there was nothing in the record to show that Infante, or Diaz-Infante, was ever a student at the University. When Infante was hired here five years ago, he listed Beraza as a reference.

Japanese Agrees To Visit Brookings

Brookings, Ore.—Former Japanese aviator Nobuo Fujita and two members of his family officially have accepted an invitation to visit the Azalea Festival here May 26-27, the Brookings-Harbor Junior Chamber of Commerce announced Tuesday.

Fujita, his wife and 25-year-old son, Yasuyoshi, are scheduled to arrive in Portland May 24. They will leave for San Francisco about June 1.

Fujita is the only enemy pilot to carry out a bombing attack on the continental United States in World War II. He flew two missions from a Japanese submarine in 1942, dropping incendiary bombs in the southwestern Oregon forests near here. The Japanese hoped the bombs would start large forest fires, but they did no damage. The Jaycees may arrange for him to fly over the area where he dropped his bombs.

Fujita, 51, is now a merchant in Tokyo.

Train Executives

New York—UPI—The young man on the way up is getting a fresh boost these days by going to "school" right where he works.

Some leading industrial concerns have adopted a new method of training their junior and middle level executives for top management posts.

It's called the Conference Management Training plan and consists of weekly conferences after business hours. The executives, working from texts supplied by the Alexander Hamilton Institute, executive training specialists, discuss facts supplied by the texts in the light of their own company's activities and are assigned tests.

The programs are conducted without instructors. At each session a member acts as the conference leader. The program is directed and administered by the company on an in-plant basis with each participant paying at least part of its cost.

Deilenback Attends Church Meeting

John R. Deilenback, Medford lawyer, is in Denver, Colo., this week serving as a member of the Permanent Judicial commission of the United Presbyterian church in the U.S.A.

He is one of eight ministers and seven laymen elected by the General Assembly of the Church to serve on the commission, the highest judicial court of the church's government.

The commission will bring judgments to the General Assembly on five cases. One has to do with an Ohio minister who was suspended by his Presbytery after having refused to pay a portion of his income tax as a form of protest against war preparations. Another case involves a New Jersey minister whose acceptance of certain basic doctrines of the Church's Confession of Faith is in question.

The General Assembly of the United Presbyterian church will convene Thursday with more than 900 delegates from every Presbytery in the nation. Deilenback is a member of the Westminster Presbyterian church, Medford.
