Visitors included Kenneth Kelley, Josephine County deputy, and Mrs. Kelley; Art Strickland, master of Josephine County Pomona Grange, and David Strickland, Josephine County youth chairman.

Lecturer Mabel Wertz announced that the tentative meeting place of subordinate lecturers for instruction in recreational mixers at State Grange would be at Fruitdale Grange, Grants Pass, May 15.
