

Installment Buying Makes Start in Europe

New York - (UPI) - Installment buying has made a start in Europe but bankers and financiers there must overcome a traditional prejudice against mass use of it if full benefits are to be felt from the Common Market, a United States financier said today.

Theodore H. Silbert, president of Standard Financial

Corp., returned this week from Amsterdam, where he addressed a meeting of Netherlands bankers. He told them that the European bankers must break the "barrier of suspicion toward consumer credit" as quickly as possible.

Silbert hastened to say that he was an admirer of the Netherlands banking community, which he said has done a "wonderful job" in international financial management.

Strong Pressures

"But nearly all the European bankers and financiers are subject to strong pressures against setting up anything like the great consumer credit machinery we have in this country," he said.

Silbert said he told European colleagues that over a period of many years, even during the depression, the

American consumer "performed better than any security" from a loss standpoint; that individuals using installment buying have an exceptional record, largely stemming from the desire of the individual using it to maintain his credit standing.

Now, he said, is the time for the European banker and financial community to realize that, so far as their potential home markets are concerned, "mass production without mass credit would be a similar improbability."

Oldtime Allies Become Political Enemies at Polls

Salem - (UPI) - Sometimes the wheel of political fortune makes a crazy turn, and old-time allies find themselves warring on each other for the same office. Friday's election provides a stark example of this in Oregon.

The situation is the only one like it in the state for years. It came about by the 1961 reapportionment of seats in the legislature.

Although both are incumbents, only one can survive the Friday primary because their separate senatorial districts are now merged into one by population shifts.

Until now, Ziegler represented Benton county, and Leth represented Polk county. Both want to remain in the legislature, and both filed for the new joint seat last March.

While they have never been exactly close personal chums, the situation has been all the more intense since they come from the same party - Republican.

Ziegler, 63, has been a legislator for 13 years; Leth, 59, for seven years. Leth is a field superintendent for a cannery in West Salem; Ziegler man-

ages a dairy in Corvallis. Both have been key fixtures in agriculture legislation and matters.

Although the campaign hasn't had much statewide publicity, it has been bitter, as political survival usually is.

The winner will go into the November election against Emmet T. Rogers, a Salem land developer unopposed for the Democratic nomination.

There'd be some letting of solon blood in November, too, because of that same spin of the wheel - reapportionment.

Four members of the Oregon House of Representatives are affected.

They all hold office now, but only two of them can survive in November to fill the two seats left by creation of new legislative districts.

This will pit members of opposition parties against each
