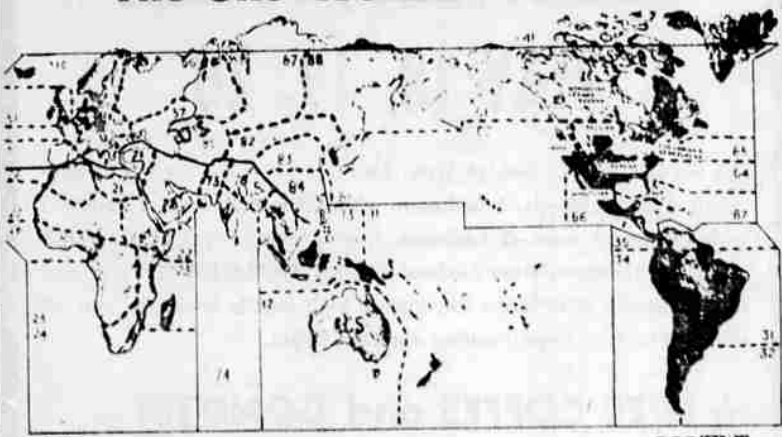

The One-Worlder's Dream



A vote for the Home Rule Charter is a vote for a one world government.

According to plan (picture above) as announced in Harper's Magazine August, 1958 the world will be divided into 51 regions and 8 zones, with a dictator at the top called "World Director". Under him will be 8 Zone Directors, under them will be 51 Regional Directors, all appointed.

The United States and Canada will be divided into regions, all will be policed by alien troops. The military forces of this country will be sent to six different sections of the divided world. (Capsule News June 11, 1960.)

The United States will be divided into 15 Federal Regions, county and state lines will be abolished (county lines are already abolished in Connecticut and former local power concentrated at Hartford, the state capital) (Capsule News, June 4, 1960.) The steps, according to plan, first a City Manager form of government, second a County Manager form of government, falsely called Home Rule, or, metro (one and the same), third Regional, or, Metropolitan form of government, all built on the same pattern. A model of a proposed Mall area is on view in the Capital building at Salem, Ore. The buildings contained in this palatial area, 30 blocks, appear to be sufficient to house a bureaucracy well in excess of 30,000. The state now employs in the neighborhood of 15,000. Is this to be the headquarters of North America Region Four? (Oregon Yardstick, March 28, 1961.)

Friday the voters will decide which type of government they want.

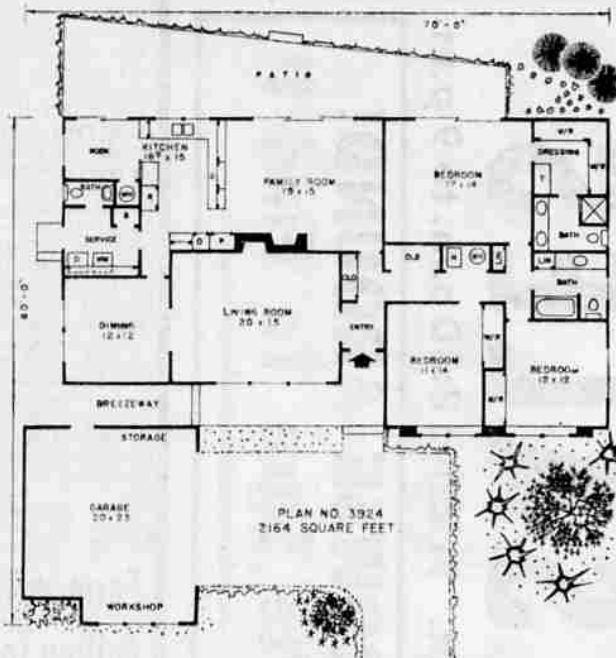
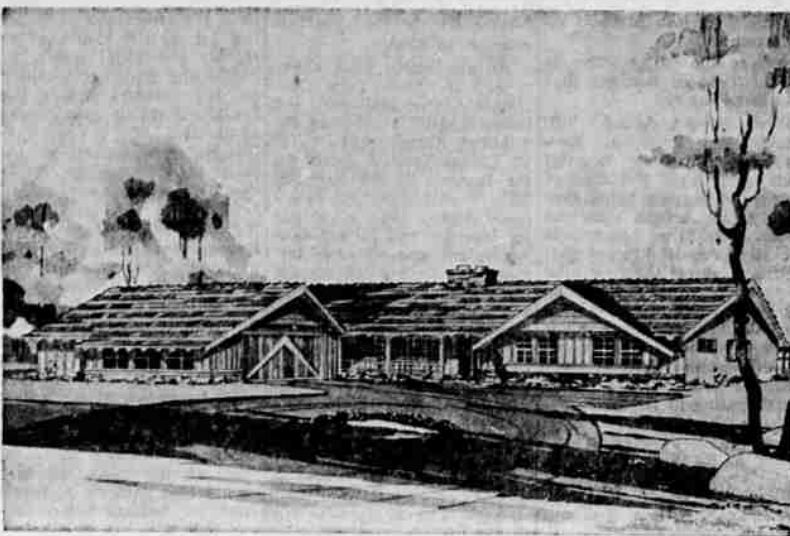
The spacious formal living room is well lighted and free of cross traffic. Double sliding doors open from the living room to the dining room. With a separate dining room, large scale entertaining is feasible.

In addition to the pleasant living room which is located apart from the daily household activities, there is a large informal family room. For the average family, the open kitchen-family room can be a safe play area for the children, a room where teenagers can enjoy themselves without disturbing adults in the living room and a wonderful setting for informal parties.

Sliding Glass Doors

Sliding glass doors open from the nook area, family room and master bedroom to the roomy patio at the rear of the house. This not only gives all of these areas an extra feeling of spaciousness but guarantees well lighted rooms and the opportunity for outdoor living in privacy.

For informal meals, a very large nook area provides an adequate area to accommodate the family plus guests. The patio is so readily accessible from the kitchen that many



meals will be served here throughout the year.

Notice what a wealth of closet space there is in this house. Four closets open onto the entry and bedroom hall.

The master bedroom suite features a private dressing room with an unusual amount of wardrobe space plus a dressing table.

A covered front porch leads to a roofed breezeway with access to the oversized garage.

The low ground - hugging lines of this rustic ranch style home have been emphasized by the low garage roof and the gable bay at the front of the bedroom wing. Tapered barge boards are used at each gable and have been repeated in the design of the garage door.
