Qualifiers From 12 Schools in 6 A-2 Meet on Saturday

Entrants from the Rogue league should dominate the scoring in the District 6 A-2 track meet Saturday at Ashland on the strength of performances in subdistrict meets last week end.

Twelve schools from the Rogue and Umpqua Valley leagues will be represented in the meet from which the first two placers of each event and those which meet minimum qualifying standards will gain spots in the state meet. District runoff on the Southern Oregon college field will get underway with field events at 1 p.m.

Athletes contending will be from St. Mary's, Phoenix, Eagle Point, Rogue River, Lakeview and Henley of the Rogue circuit and Douglas, Myrtle Creek, Sutherlin, Reddie, Glendale and Glendale of the Umpqua Valley loop.

On the strength of marks in last week end's Rogue and Umpqua meet, only the schools of the southern subdistrict should dominate the point production in nine events and the northern schools in one. Points should be more evenly divided in four events with edge indicated to the north in three contests and to the south in one.

No Guarantee
Judging from last week end's competition, first places in 10 events could go to participants from the Rogue schools and in four to Umpqua thinculds. There is, however, no guarantee or certainty that they will.

Here are last week end's top efforts:

Paul Elliott, St. Mary's, 14.95 in the high hurdles and 20.4 in the low; Jim Griener, Lakeview, 10.45 in the 100-yard dash; Ed Cadman, Myrtle Creek, 4:30.6 in the mile and 2:01.25 in the half-mile; Bob Lucas, Myrtle Creek, 5:23 in the 440; Ross Barkhurst, Myrtle Creek, 23.5 in the 220; John Granby, Phoenix, 47 feet 6 1/2 inches in shot put; Darrell Scott, Eagle Point, 137.9 in the discus; Rickey Richey, Phoenix, 182-3/4 in the javelin; Charles Cossey, Lakeview, 20-3/4 in the broad jump; Lew Whipple, Eagle Point, 5-8 1/2 in the high jump; Tom Anacker, Lakeview, and Ron Williams, Phoenix, with 11-9 in the pole vault; and Rogue River with 1:35.3 in the relays.

Defending district champs qualified are Cadman in the mile, Barry Frantz, Rogue River, in the 440 and 220; Griener in the 100; Larry Taylor, Lakeview, in the 880; and the Lakeview relay team with two new members.

Events in which subdistrict results indicate the Rogue entries could pick up the bulk of the points are the high hurdles, 100, 220, 880, shot put, javelin, broad jump, pole vault and relay. North qualifiers could dominate the mile and have the edge in the 440, discus and high jump points with southern entrants having a slight edge in the low hurdle points.

Ashland - It's countdown time this weekend in Monmouth where the Oregon Collegiate conference champions in tennis, golf, and track and field will be up for grabs. And, from all indications, the Southern Oregon Red Raiders

and Portland State Vikings are expected to run off with the lion's share of the honors. All five member schools of the OCC will contend for the track and golf titles, while only SOC, PSC and Oregon college will vie for the tennis crown.

The golf championship will be decided on Friday in Salem, and the tennis action also begins on Friday but will not conclude until Saturday. Saturday morning the cinder competition starts with finals in most events to be run off in the afternoon.

Southern Oregon has won the team title in tennis for the past two years. The PSC Vikings are defending champions in both track and golf. Portland State has already claimed the OCC baseball crown.

The Red Raider tennis crew heads into the OCC matches with an 8-5 season record.

Baltimore - (UPI) - Handicappers are still struggling to come up with the favorite for Saturday's \$150,000 added Preakness Stakes, which is expected to draw 11 starters when entries are accepted today.

Should it be Decidedly, the Kentucky Derby winner from California; Ridan, third in the Kentucky Derby, or Jaipur, a newcomer to the classics who boasts an impressive record of six wins in nine races with three seconds? Each was listed at 3 to 1 in the early betting line.

Also expected to be named for the mile and three-sixteenth race - one-sixteenth of a mile shorter than the Kentucky Derby - were: Roman Line, Greek Money, Sunrise Country, Crimson Satan, Vimy Ridge, Green Hornet, Prego and Flying Johnnie.

Medford Boys 52nd in Tourney

Two Medford boys' teams of the junior high age group (13-15) won trophies in the 17th annual mailographic handicap tournament of the American Junior Bowling congress.

Medford Bowling lanes team was 52nd with 2698 and Rogue Equipment Sales 232nd with 2605.

Scores for the Medford lanes crew were Chet Stickley 498, Bob Mills 472, Bill Dickinson 461, Jim Wise 529 and A. T. Highland 545. It added a 195-pin handicap. For Rogue Equipment Duane Windham had 584 and gained an award for an over 575 game in his class. Other scores were John Pruitt 467, Don Lewis 419, Terry Bryan 465 and Mike Barker 427. The team had a 243 handicap.

New Hunter Safety Class Will Begin on May 24 At Medford Rifle Club

Next class in hunter safety at Medford Rifle and Pistol club for young people of the area will start on May 24.

The instruction, under the supervision of the Jackson County Hunter Safety Instructors association, will consist of five lesson periods over the same number of weeks.

Young people wishing to register for the course may fill out parent release forms and get them approved by parents or guardians. The forms are at Lampport's, Sam's and Century Sporting Goods stores and Hubbard Brothers Hardware store. After parents have signed the forms they may be returned to the store from which they were obtained.

At the four locations boys and girls may register for a hunter safety course in any location in the county. Officers of the instructors association will collect the forms and assign them to instructors, currently.

Boys and girls under 18 years of age are now required to have a certificate showing they have successfully completed an approved hunter safety course before they can hunt on lands in Oregon other than their own or their parents' or guardians.

Four Compulsory Periods
Officers have pointed out to the young people that, if they expect to hunt this fall, they should arrange to get their certificates at an early date.

Four periods of two hours each are compulsory in the instruction. The fifth period, which involves actual firing on the rifle range, is recommended.

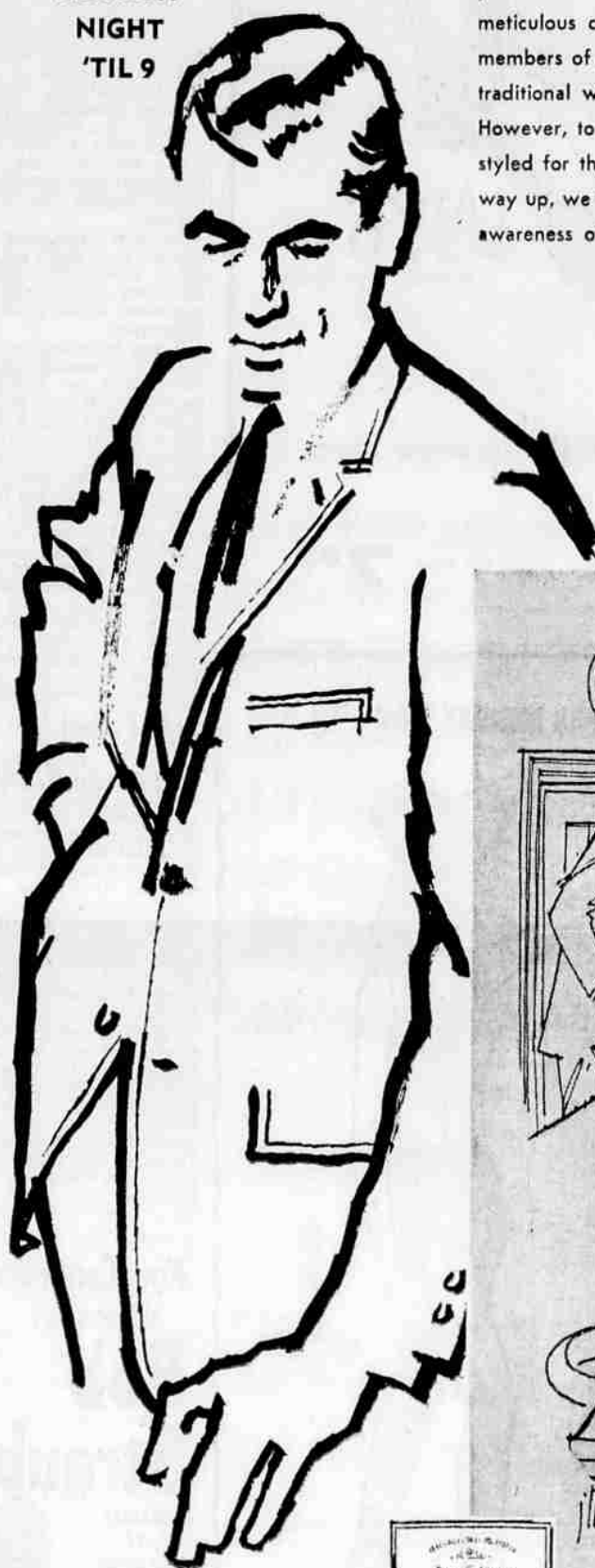
