

Grants Pass High Caveman Romp To District 6 A-1 Track Title

Klamath Falls — Grants Pass high, as expected, grabbed the largest portion of the honors here Saturday in the District 6 A-1 track meet, despite a number of surprises.

Rolling up a massive total of 191 1/3 points, the Cavemen collected a total of 18 berths for the state championship session next week-end at Corvallis. And, they were far ahead of the rest of the field in the total points of this district affair.

Medford was far back in second place with 89 1/3 points. Crater tabulated 76, Klamath Falls 40 and Ashland 20 1/3.

Myrtle Creek Vikings Garner District 6 A-2 Track Crown; St. Mary's Second in Meet

Ashland — Myrtle Creek high, headed by Ross Barkhurst and Ed Cadman won its first District 6 A-2 track and field diadem here Saturday.

Barkhurst and Cadman each captured two first places and Cadman gained a second and anchored the second place relay team as the Vikings played up 88 points to outscore St. Mary's of Medford by 22 markers. St. Mary's 66 was followed by Rogue River's 54, Phoenix's 52 and Eagle Point's 40 in the 12 team field.

Four records fell in the meet and a fifth was tied.

St. Mary's equaled Myrtle Creek in total first places with four. Eagle Point took two and Lakeview, Phoenix, Rogue River and Sutherlin each one. The Vikings gained eight berths in the state tourney. St. Mary's six. Rogue River qualified for four, Phoenix three, Eagle Point and Lakeview two and Douglas, Glendale and Sutherlin one apiece.

First and second placers qualified for trips to the Oregon A-2 meet next Friday and Saturday at Corvallis.

dy day but no records were allowed because of the 10 to 20 miles per hour wind. The wind may have helped, however, in some additional qualifying as six extra state spots were gained by equaling or bettering performance standards.

Each Gained Seven
 Crater and Medford each got seven places in the state meet and Klamath Falls two. Paul Noel, a baseball outfielder for Klamath Falls, contending in his second track meet of the season for the Pels, bettered standards which have stood since 1934 when he won the 100-yard dash in 9.7 and the 220 in 22.1 for his team's only entries in the state. The recognized marks of 9.8 and 22.2 were

set by Bob Leslie, Klamath. Medford's Jim Hill ran a 9.7 in the morning qualifying Saturday but pulled a muscle in the 100 final and was scratched from the rest of the meet.

Medford's Scott Eaton won the high hurdles in 14.4, which is 2 under district standards. Crater's John Champ tied the record with 19.6 in his victory in the lows. Steve Toews of Medford was under the 2:01 record in the half-mile, nabbing the event in 2:00.3.

Bauer Beat Bauer
 Grants Pass took seven first places. Crater three and Medford two along with Klamath Falls.

Marty Bauer took the 104 yard put for GP with 50 feet 10 inches to beat out Medford's Paul Bauer by one-fourth inch. Steve Ausland won the javelin, Larry Lindquist the 440, Mike Curtis the discus, Cliff Lyons the mile and Gary Van Koten the pole vault for the Cavemen who also were first in the relay.

Medford's Dennis Brumback was unable to give Lyons the anticipated battle in the mile. He pulled a tendon in warm up and was pulled out of the race halfway through.

Added to Champ's win in the low hurdles for Crater was Paul Bransom's first in the broad jump and Dwight James' verdict in the high jump for the Comets.

Eaton Knots Shepherd
 Grants Pass garnered eight of its state berths on second places. Medford three seconds and a share of one and Crater two. Medford's Eaton tied with the high jump favorite, Bob Shepherd, Grants Pass, for a second at 5-10 and will go to state on the basis of less misses than the Caveman.

Other runnersup for Medford were the aforementioned Paul Bauer, in the shot, Scott Hampson in the 440 and Hi Martin in the mile. George Jannusch gained a No. 2 spot for Crater in the javelin and the Comets were second in the relay.

GP seconds included Dennis O'Leary in the broad jump and low hurdles, Bob Wilson in the high hurdles, Richard Ireland in the 100 and 220, Montgomery in the half and a share by Dan McIntire and Vick Van Koten in the pole vault with Dan Lewis, Ashland. Either Van Koten or McIntire will go to state.

Muller Qualifies
 Crater qualified Dick Muller for state in the javelin because his 190-8 third place beat the requirement of 190. Since the first five in the high hurdles were 14-8 or un-Champ and either O'Leary or Randy Clark, GP, can go to state along with Eaton and Wilson. Grants Pass coach Russ Werner must pick between O'Leary and Clark because only two from a school can enter an event at Corvallis. O'Leary was third yesterday and Clark fifth.

Among third placers who also made state are Hampson, Medford, with a 10.1 century and Gil Smith, GP, with a 19-75 low hurdle clocking.
