

SNELL OUTSPEEDS BURELSON IN MILE

By HENRY RIEGER • Los Angeles — The adjectives flowed today in descriptions of the 22nd annual Coliseum Relays, which saw New Zealand's Peter Snell run the fastest mile ever in the United States and big men Al Oerter and Dallas Long set new world records. "It was great," "tremendous," were some of the descriptions of the 40,007 half-chilled fans plus 700 athletes who sat and competed late into the cool evening in Los Angeles Memorial Coliseum. Snell's successful challenge of America's premier miler, Dyrrol Burelson, provided the big thrill of the night when he turned full blast in the

Tarr Smashes Mark In Far West Meet

Eugene — (UPI) — NCAA champion Jerry Tarr smashed a 12-year-old American collegiate record in the 120-yard hurdles Saturday as he led Oregon to a victory in the Far West track and field championships. Tarr was clocked in 13.3 seconds, just one-tenth of a second off the world's record held by Germany's Martin Lauer and Lee Calhoun of the United States. Tarr's effort shattered the record of 13.5 held by Dick Attlesley of Southern California since 1950. Oregon's unbeaten forces scored 98 1/2 points to win the meet for the ninth consecutive time. Oregon State finished second with 65 1/2 followed by Washington State with 39 1/2, Idaho with 33 1/2 and Washington with 32. Oregon did not even use

Miller Dyrrol Burelson, who finished second to world record holder Peter Snell in the "Miracle Mile" at Los Angeles Friday night. In addition to the meet record set by Tarr, four other meet records were broken. They were set by Oregon's Dave Steen in the shot put, Keith Forman in the three-mile run, Terry Llewellyn in the high jump and Washington's John Cramer in the pole vault. Mike Lehner of Oregon set a field record in the steeplechase, which was run for the first time in the meet, as were the 440-yard relay and the 440-yard hurdles events. The 220-yard dash turned into a 200-yard dash when meet officials set themselves up at the wrong finish line. They started checking when Harry Jerome of Oregon won the event in 18.7 seconds.

Paul Blinka Bat Champ Of Raiders

Ashland — Outfielder Paul Blinka won the Southern Oregon college baseball batting average title with a .333 mark over 15 games. Blinka, a freshman from Grants Pass, Ore., had 13 hits in 39 times at bat and also led the Red Raiders in home runs with three. Senior catcher Jess Munyon was 23-75 at the plate for a .307 mark and versatile Dave Hughes batted .304 on the season with a team-leading 28 base hits in 92 at-bats. Hughes, a junior from Gridley, Calif., also led the Raiders in pitching statistics. He hurled the most innings, 48 2/3, gave up only 26 hits and 11 earned runs for a 2.07 ERA, struck out 53 opposing batters, and compiled a 4 win, 2 loss record. Senior right-hander Earle Tichenor also posted a 4-2 win-loss record, and was third in ERA with a 2.97. Hughes heads RBI's. Hughes also was the run-batted-in leader with 19 in 25 games, and was second behind Damien Rossetto in runs scored with 16. Rossetto, junior outfielder, led with 18, while also drawing the most bases on balls, 18. Second baseman John Buck led in stolen bases with 12, and was second in both RBIs with 14 and walks with 17. Southern Oregon team hitting was .245 on 171 hits in 697 at-bats with 92 RBI. Opponents had a .241 average on 180 safe blows in 748 trips and 70 RBI. Raider batsmen also collected seven homers this year while SOC pitchers blanked their foes in the four-base category. Southern Oregon, which lost its final three Oregon Collegiate Conference games to league champion Portland State, had an 8-4 record in the OCC and was 14-11 on the season.

Clay Hands Daniels 1st Defeat

New York — (UPI) — Cassius Clay, unbeaten heavyweight contender, tagged tall Billy Daniels with his first defeat Saturday night on a seventh-round technical knockout but Clay lost prestige in doing it. Referee Mark Conn stopped the nationally televised bout at 2:21 of the seventh round amid the booing of the 1,642 fans in St. Nicholas Arena, Daniels, of St. Albans, N. Y., was bleeding profusely from a two-inch gash on his left brow and from the nose and a cut under his right eye. Twenty-year-old Clay of Louisville, Ky., former Olympic light heavyweight champion, achieved his 14th straight victory as a professional and his 11th knockout, the last six of which were consecutive. The fans apparently thought Referee Conn should have permitted Daniels to continue despite the blood, for he had provided Clay with unexpected opposition for a 5-1 underdog. Twenty-four year old Daniels, unranked among contenders, suffered his first professional defeat after 16 straight victories, but he showed that Clay may get knocked out by the first good boxer-puncher he faces.

Southern Oregon Lifts OCC Cinder Diadem From PSC

Monmouth — Southern Oregon college yesterday broke the three year reign of Portland State as Oregon collegiate conference track champion. The Red Raiders of the Rogue River broke the diadem by edging a stubborn - yielding Viking squad 67 to 64 1/2. It was a five school meet but the other three schools were not in contention. Eastern Oregon scored 15, Oregon Tech 10 and Oregon college 8. Three official records fell to the Raiders. Jerry Arndt won the mile with 4:25 and the team of Doyle Bransom, Charles Swingle, Bill White and Dave Graham the mile relay in 3:27.5. They are SOC school marks as well as new conference standards. Mike Hanby and Spike Gordon cleared 12 feet 11 1/2 inches bettering the OCC record but the mark was not allowed over a measurement technically. Bransom was a triple winner with 10.0 in the 100, 22.5 in the 220 and 21-7 1/2 in the

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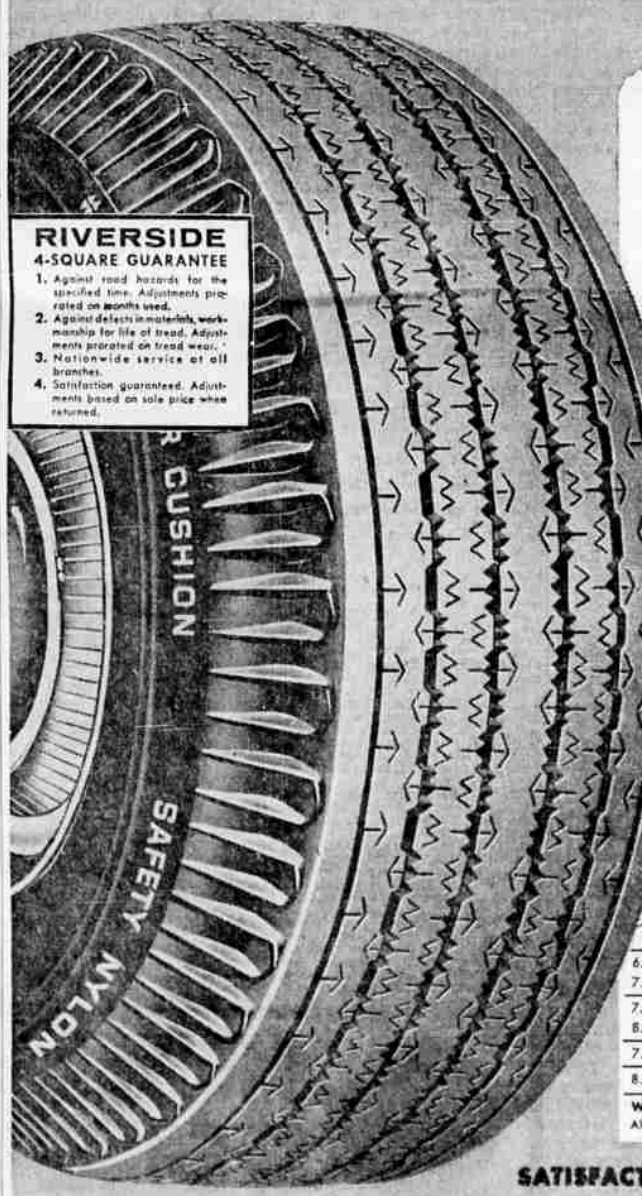
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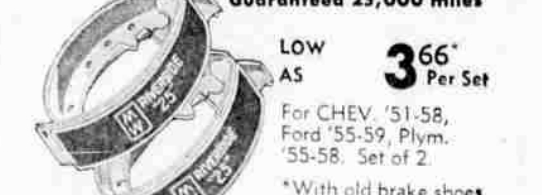


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
