

Ycaza Gets Suspension

Baltimore, Md.—Jockey Manny Ycaza today began a 30-day suspension for alleged "unfair tactics" that may never have been discovered had he not claimed a foul against champion Greek Money in Saturday's Preakness Stakes.

And for making "a frivolous claim of foul" the fiery Panamanian jockey was fined \$200 by the stewards of Pimlico, who suspended him 10 racing days and recommended to the Maryland racing commission that the suspension be extended an additional 20 days.

The commission will act upon the recommendation on Wednesday.

Ycaza, aboard Ridan, was charged with leaning against Greek Money's jockey, Johnny Rotz, putting his elbow across him in an attempt to hamper Rotz in the last few strides of the race.

Greek Money and Ridan battled through the stretch in the second of the Triple Crown classics. Greek Money took the lead with an eighth of a mile to go. Ridan regained it at the 16th pole. And then with a final surge, Greek Money won by a nose in the last few jumps.

Ycaza claimed foul after the race and the stewards viewed motion pictures of the action. They saw enough immediately to throw out the foul claim and then take another look when the day's racing was over.

"If no claim had been made, we might have not have looked at the films at all since Saturday was the last day of the meeting," said Joseph F. Flanagan, steward representing the commission. "Usually we review the pictures the next day, in this case Monday. It is possible this may not have been discovered."

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Lewis & Clark Wins Track Championships
