

NY Group Asks Alfaro Tax Record

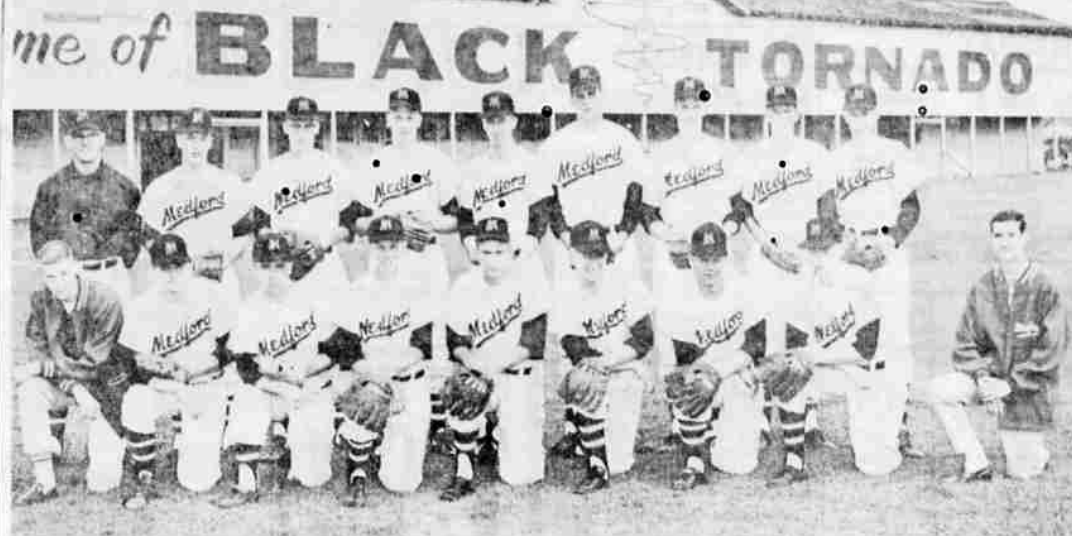
