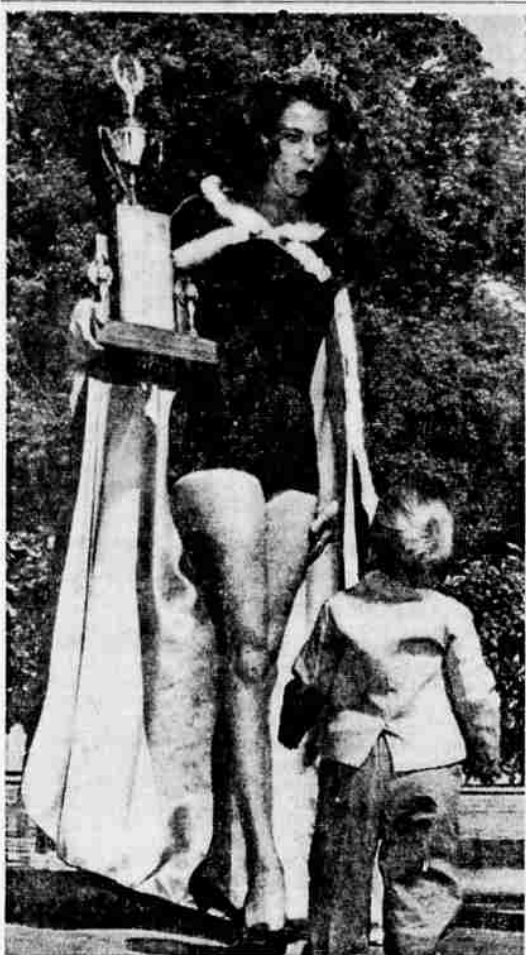




County Has Four Candidates for Dairy Princess

Jackson county has four candidates for Oregon Dairy Princess. Final judging will be over June 15.

Candidates are Georgia Hubbard, Eagle Point, Connie McDonough, of the Jackson county agricultural stabilization and conservation office, Barbara Gysin, Coal Mine rd., and Karen Jossy, Eagle Point.

The candidates are available for various club meetings, according to George Holt, Phoenix, chairman of the June Dairy Month celebration.

Local winners of various county contests become eligible to compete in the state contest June 25 and 26 when Oregon's first lady of the dairy industry will be crowned in Portland.

Princess Barbara Steinfeld, Scappoose, will crown her successor and the new princess will receive a \$350 wardrobe, a scholarship and a trip to Chicago to enter the American Dairy Princess contest.

Single girls between 16 and 25 with a dairy farm background, were eligible, Holt said.

Chairman of the state contest is John Eberhard, Redmond.

Mrs. Ernest Radomske and L. F. Buchanan, of Jackson and Josephine counties, respectively, are county chairmen of the contest.

Oregon Supreme Court Decisions

Salem—A man who was hurt when a car hit his truck head-on at a bridge on the Corvallis-Lebanon highway had his judgment of \$12,500 affirmed by the Oregon Supreme Court Wednesday.

Winning the judgment was Rufus E. Hiddleston, Albany.

The other motorist, Mrs. Violet L. Ross, was killed but Hiddleston sued her estate, through Administrator Raymond Ross.

The decision supporting Linn County Circuit Judge Wendell H. Tompkins was written per curiam, or by all seven members of the high court.

In a Clackamas County case, Louis C. Thomas, a logger, won \$22,724 from his employer under the Employers' Liability Act in another personal injury matter. Thomas was injured while loading a log truck.

Donald R. Kaufman, appellant vs. Rita Fisher, administratrix of the estate of John Howard Fisher; appeal from Clackamas county; opinion by Justice Kenneth O'Connell; Judge Howard J. Blanding reversed; car accident case, a judgment of nonsuit against Kaufman was reversed, and

sent back for further proceedings.

Imperial Investment Co., appellant vs. James G. Rouse and Canal Insurance Co., respondent; appeal from Multnomah county; opinion by Justice Alfred T. Goodwin; Judge Herbert M. Schwab reversed; appeal by a creditor in garnishment proceedings, a judgment awarding the creditor 25 per cent of its claim was reversed, case sent back and a judgment ordered to the extent needed to satisfy the claim.

Bradley, defendant, and Justitia Bradley, appellant; appeal from Lane county; opinion by Justice Harold J. Warner; Judge Winston L. Bradshaw affirmed; decree foreclosing a chattle mortgage on a log truck affirmed.

Clarence R. Stephens, appellant vs. City of St. Helens, and Carroll Hansen; appeal from Columbia county; opinion by Justice Goodwin; Judge J. S. Bohannon reversed; a judgment for the case was overturned, and orders given to enter a judgment for Stephens.
