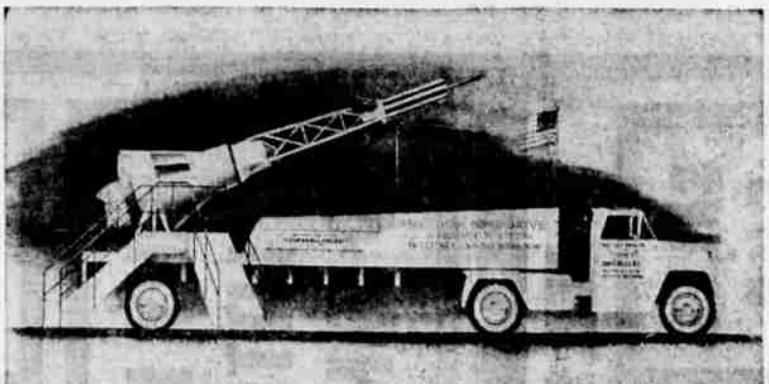

Politicians File Campaign Expenses

Salem - (UPI) - The committee that worked for the successful nomination of Republican Sig Unander, Portland, for the U.S. Senate spent \$29,321, the State Election Division said Friday. The primary election campaign expense report filed here said that expenses equalled contributions.

Another report filed in the campaign that renominated Sen. Wayne Morse (D-Ore.) put total contributions of the Morse campaign at \$30,367. But the report indicated only \$18,843 was spent, as reported earlier. The new total came with the filing of a \$10,000 contribution to Morse from the Oregon AFL-CIO's committee on Political Education (COPE), although COPE indicated it got the money from the national AFL-CIO.

Biggest single contributor in the Morse effort other than COPE was a labor-sponsored testimonial dinner in Portland, The December, 1961, dinner brought in \$7,944. Nicholas Reisini, New York, and Alex Deusch, Los Angeles, both gave \$1,000 to Morse.

Single biggest contributor in the Unander campaign was John C. Higgins of Portland, \$2,000. Those making \$1,000 contributions included Robert Beggs and Edmund Hayes, 61.

Director Dies - Portland - Dies - Egil E. Krogh, general merchandise manager and member of the board of directors of Meier & Frank Frank Co., died of a heart attack at his home in Lake Oswego, seven miles south of here Friday. He was 61.

Bids Opened for Nurses' Housing

Bids were opened last week for construction of nurses' housing units at Rogue Valley hospital.

Plans prepared by Medford Architects Edson and Pappas call for construction of three structures of one three-plex unit and two four-plex units. Four bachelorette units having living room, kitchenette and bath will be provided. There will be six one-bedroom units with living room, bath and kitchen, and one two-bedroom unit.

Total building area will be about 6,000 square feet and an equivalent area will be provided in carpools and in patios surrounded by redwood screen panels.

The bids are under study, according to Charles L. Gustafson, low bidder was Graff and James, Medford, at \$185,000.
