Eisenhower Willing To Go To Jail for Cause of Farmers

Washington - (UPI) - Former President Dwight D. Eisenhower was quoted today as offering to go to jail if necessary to block government regulation of farmers.

An Agriculture Department spokesman, in reply, said this not only would not be necessary but that under the Kennedy administration farm program it would not be possible. Only civil penalties are provided for noncooperating farmers in the current Kennedy farm bill, the spokesman said.

Rep. Catherine May (R-Wash.) said Eisenhower, now a Gettysburg, Pa., cattle grower, told her he never took a cent of government money on his farm, and that "he would be damned if he just wouldn't rather go to jail than to submit" to the kind of control he said once was proposed by President Kennedy.

Angry Reaction

In a newsletter describing her talk with the former President at his Gettysburg office last week, along with a number of other GOP lawmakers, Mrs. May said:

"Mr. Eisenhower expressed a very angry reaction to some of the original Kennedy farm programs because they contained jail sentence penalties for farmers who refused to cooperate."

"After going into some detail about how he had never asked for and never taken a cent of government money on his farm, he declared that if any of these proposed regulated programs became law he wouldn't rather go to jail than to submit."

Piggy-Back Hike Record Claimed

La Grande - (UPI) - Six La Grande boys claimed a world record for piggy-back hiking Wednesday, after carrying one of their number 28 miles.

The hike took just under six hours and broke a record of 27 1/2 miles the boys said was set recently at Vancouver, Wash.

Five of the 17-year-old boys, Mike Beech, Mike Howard, Tom Jones, John Moser and Frank Miller, took turns carrying 145-pound Bob Dalton the entire trip.

The attempt began at 7 a.m. when they were taken 28 miles south of here on U.S. Highway 30. They reached La Grande shortly before 1 p.m. More assistants in a car supplied them with lunch and drinking water along the way.

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Kennedy Returns For Light Schedule

Washington - (UPI) - President Kennedy returned to a relatively light schedule at the White House today after a brief holiday birthday observance at his Middleburg, Va., country estate.

The President's helicopter landed on the White House lawn this morning.

The only activities on his schedule for the day were acceptance of a report from his committee on juvenile delinquency and youth crimes and an informal speech to the American Foreign Service Association.

Disease Probably Is Carried Through Air

New York - (UPI) - Mononucleosis, a grippelike disease, is probably airborne, the Medical and Pharmaceutical Information bureau reports.

Epidemics sweep through schools and colleges. As a result, mononucleosis has been called the kissing disease. "Obviously, if it can be spread through the air, it can also be transmitted by kissing, but it isn't necessarily so," the bureau said.

33,500 Persons Hear Billy Graham in Chicago Crusade

Chicago - (UPI) - Billy Graham preached to 33,500 persons Wednesday night during the opening of his three-week Chicago Crusade and team members said 532 of them stepped forward to make "decisions for Christ."

Members of the Graham team said it was the largest crowd to attend an opening night meeting. The services will continue nightly through June 16 in McCormick Place, and conclude in the huge Soldier Field June 17.

The response to Graham's invitation to "repent, and by faith receive Christ," was almost instantaneous after he had finished his 30-minute sermon.

Dozens Follow

A man, holding his face with a handkerchief, his wife and their two children came forward immediately. Behind them came dozens, young and old, men and women, filling the area in front of the mammoth stage and the aisles leading to it.

One was a young man in shirt sleeves carrying a transistor radio. Another was a

stylishly dressed middle-aged woman who dabbed at her eyes. A young couple came together.

"We've forgotten how to blush in America," Graham said, in quoting a word from Jeremiah 6:13-16, his text. "The sons of Jeremiah's day paralleled our own. The people live in open and flagrant sin with little regard to morality."

Rebels Without Cause

"Here in Chicago there are thousands who are trying to escape the realities of life through alcohol, barbiturates, amusements, materialism and even suicide," Graham said. "Many of our young people just getting out of school have become rebels without a cause. This has become the age of the misfit."

"Even though Chicago is one of the great cultural, educational and religious centers of the world, the newspapers are filled with stories of crime every day."

"Chicago is a racial tinderbox," he said.

Graham said there is "no answer except at the foot of the cross. You can't legislate love," he said. "It must come from the heart."
