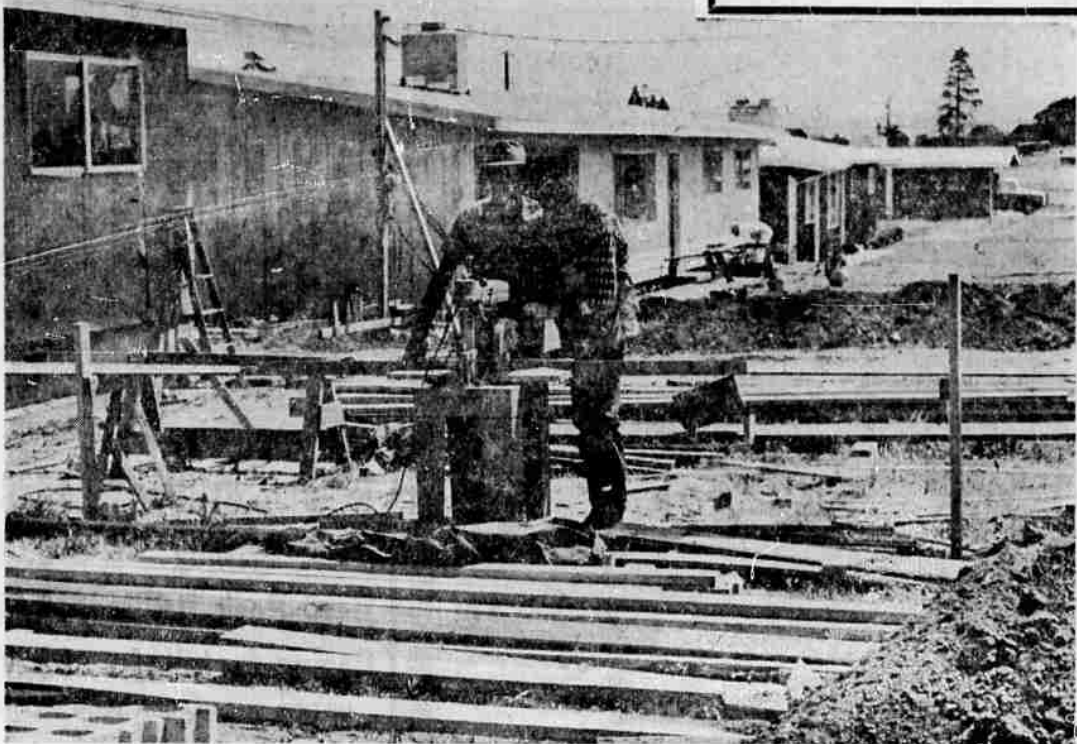
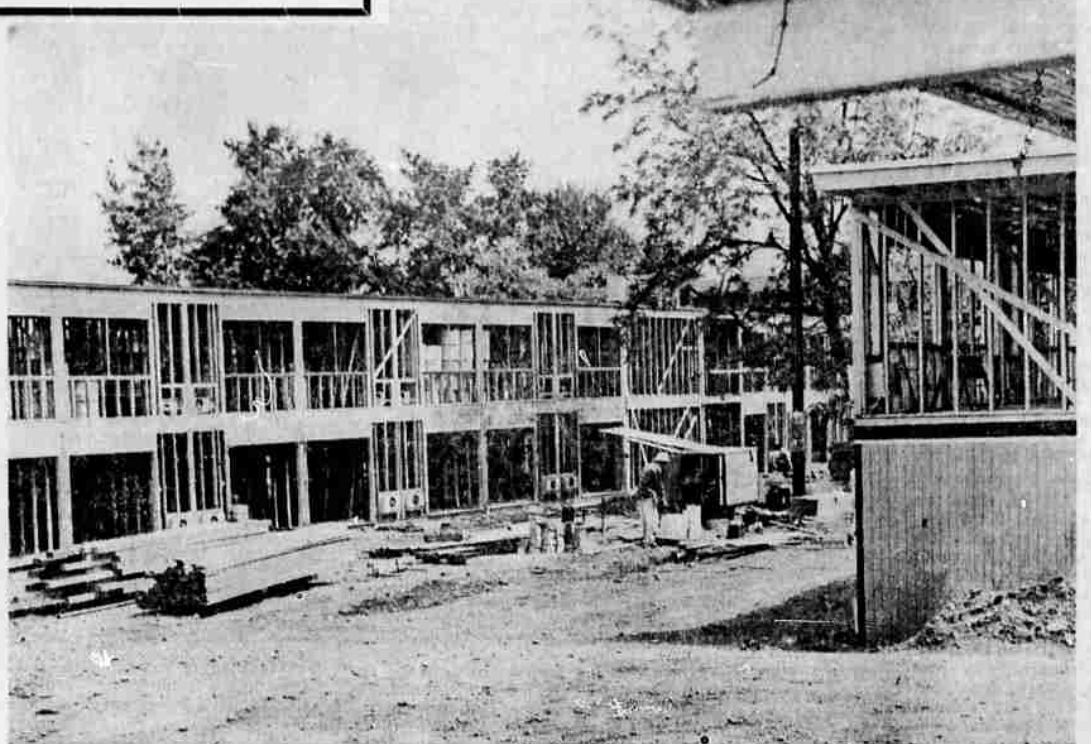

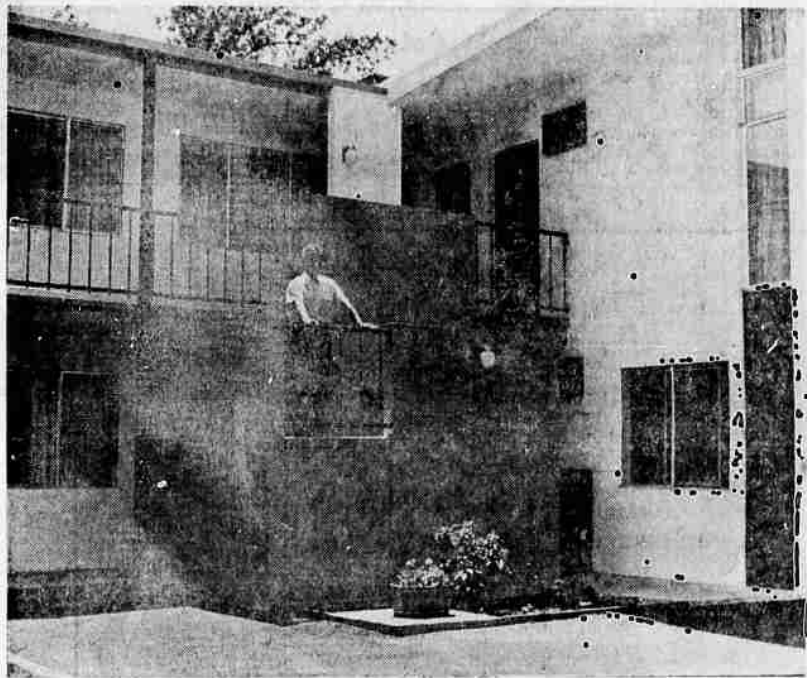


This home construction scene is in the Royal Heights subdivision, Central Point, where Virgil Ladd and Otho Cox are working on one of several new homes.

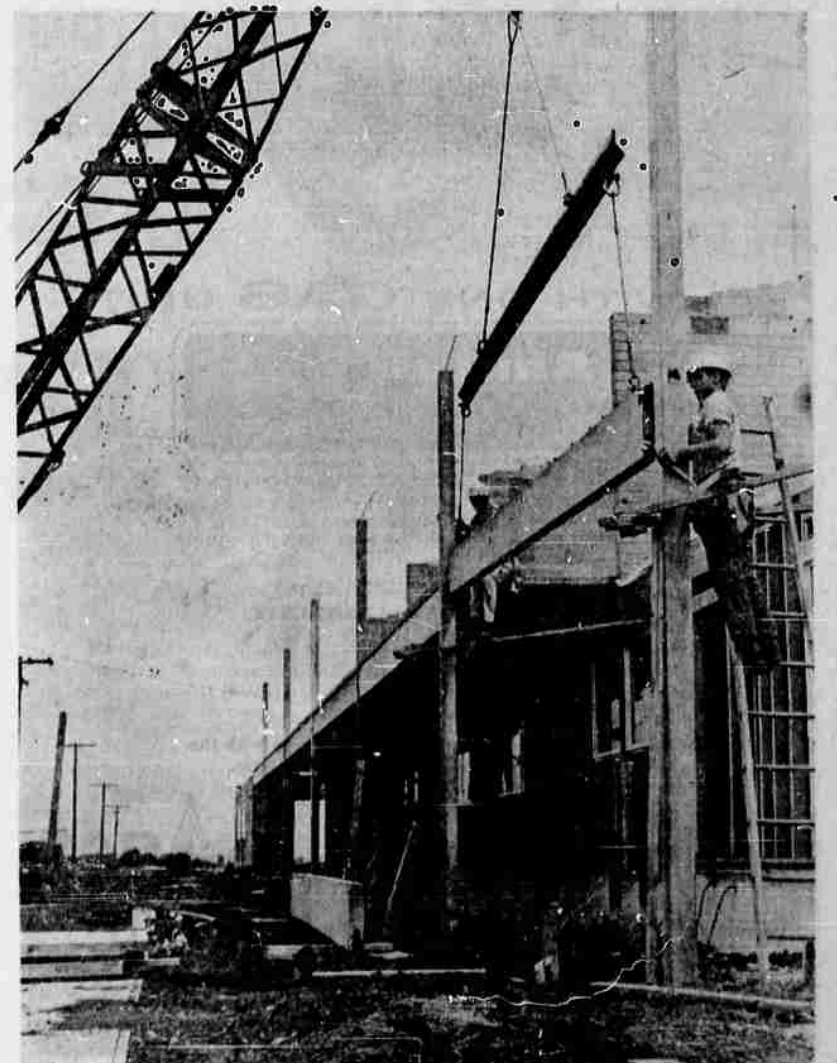
