Teletypewriter, Facsimile Installed by Weather Bureau

A teletypewriter and an Aiden facsimile, photographic transmitting machine, have been acquired by the weather bureau at the Medford airport station to facilitate the speed and accuracy of weather predictions. R. D. Church, meteorologist in charge of the Med-

ford bureau, has announced. The teletypewriter circuit joins all weather bureaus in the state and subscribers including newspapers and radio stations. Statewide forecasts, both lo-

cal and regional, are carried on the circuit, which includes advice to agricultural interests. This is sent out of Corvallis as a part of the state extension service by A. L. Zimmerman, agricultural meteorologist attached to the extension service.

In addition, weather advice is given for sports, travelers, shippers and the general public. Included are zone forecasts from Washington and northern California.

An important segment of the advice will be fire weather conditions for foresters, and river and flood forecasts, which will be used for the first time this year. Some national information is included.

The Aiden facsimile is used primarily to relay weather charts with the point of transmission in the national meteorological center in Washington, D. C. Reports of local, regional and worldwide weather conditions are sent to the center, where they are plotted and analyzed by teams of meteorologists aided by electronic computers and chart plotters. Maps are prepared, finished and transmitted. This is a time saver here, Church noted, because previously it was done locally.
