

PCL Teams Battle for 14 Innings

It took 14 innings for the Tacoma Giants to finish off Spokane, 5-4, in the first game of a doubleheader Sunday. But the second game turned out to be a duel in the rain and was postponed, leaving the Indians without a battle-ground.

The first game was tied 3-3 going into the 14th inning when Spokane's John Werhas hit a solo home run. But the Giants managed two runs in their half of the frame to end the contest.

Homers Hit

Gene Wallace also hit a home run for Spokane and John Orsino and Billy Hain powered Tacoma's two homers.

In other Pacific Coast league games Sunday night, Portland split a doubleheader at Seattle, 7-2 and 2-5; San Diego downed Hawaii, 9-2; and Salt Lake City edged Vancouver, 4-3.

Seattle's Bill Spanwick pitched a four-hit game for the Rainiers' win in their nightcap. In the first game, Ron Debus led the Portland Beavers with two home runs and a single.

DeWitt Won't Move Redlegs

Cincinnati (UPI)—Boss Bill DeWitt made it plain and positive today that he has no intention of moving the Cincinnati Reds to any other city for at least five years.

DeWitt, president of the club, made a formal statement Sunday to clarify the question of whether the Reds will remain in Cincinnati.

He issued the statement following a threat by the attorney general of Ohio to void the sale of the club to DeWitt on the charge the original bidding was not competitive.

DeWitt said he made "a firm commitment in writing" to the Crosley foundation, from whom he purchased the Reds, that he would keep the club in Cincinnati "for a period of not less than five years."

Desire for Athletes Who Do More Than Asked Told By St. Mary's Speaker

Declaring that he seeks the type of athletes "that give you more than you ask," Ted Ogdahl, head football and track coach at Willamette university, addressed the annual sports banquet of St. Mary's High school here Saturday night.

Talking in a light and humorous vein at Rogue Valley Country club, but still driving serious thoughts across Ogdahl said that, because of grade restrictions at his school, "we get tremendous people. But, that is not enough. They've got to do more than you ask."

Paul Elliott, football, basketball and track man for the Crusaders, received the John Nuich award as his school's outstanding athlete. He was also named the outstanding track man for St. Mary's. Jim Calhoun was recipient of the outstanding basketball player award and the inspiration award went to Pat Stinson. Calhoun and Stinson, like Elliott, are three sport men.

John North Honored

John North, proprietor of North's Chuck Wagon, received the outstanding citizen's award, sponsored by the St. Mary's Boosters club, in recognition of his support of sports and other school endeavors.

Ogdahl also stated that "the type of kid you need" in athletics is the kind who make the sacrifice, with no thought of self, so that someone else looks good.

"Academically," the speaker said, "you've got to have the guy who's going to graduate." He pointed out that there is more challenge today to get an education and that athletics plays a tremendous part in education.

"I think," said Ogdahl, "that the day of the guy who can lift a ton and not spell it is over."

With the tremendous academic pressure today, coaching staffs must be highly organized, the Willamette mentor said. Coaches don't get the time with the athletes they formerly did, he pointed out. He added that it is necessary, in order to have a great athletic program, to have the highest type people in the program, along with being well organized.

Athletics Equalize

"I think athletics, especially in our world today, is one of the great equalizers," Ogdahl remarked. He spoke of this as a "tremendous" and "fantastic" thing and pointed especially to track. "We match our marks against theirs (the Russians)," he said. Yet, the coach expressed the thought that "we don't do enough with our athletics."

The dinner for the athletes and the rally squad was given by the boosters club. Paul Haviland was master of ceremonies. The Very Rev. Carl Mai presented the outstanding athlete award. Others making presentations were Coach Bill McKibbin to the outstanding trackman, Coach Dick Paup to the outstanding basketball player, the Rev. William McLeod to the most inspirational athlete and R. R. (Bud) Parsons, president of Medford Linebackers, to the outstanding citizen.

Lewis Thorne of Eastern Oregon came in fifth in the 220-yard high hurdles in 24.5 and Ralph Killham of Oregon College of Education ran fifth in the 3,000-meter steeplechase in 10:05.1.

A former South Salem High school trackman, Bob Bartlett of Seattle Pacific was fourth in the 120-yard high hurdles in 14.8.

Texas Southern won the team title.
