

Two Valley Men To Receive MD Degrees Friday

Two Medford High school graduates will receive the degree of doctor of medicine at the University of Oregon Medical school commencement ceremonies June 8 in Portland.

Thomas Andrew Gail, son of Mr. and Mrs. Budd W. Gail, 416 South Cleveland ave., will take his internship at the U. S. Naval hospital in San Diego, Calif. He is also a graduate of Willamette university.

Richard Haviland Johnson, son of Mr. and Mrs. Perry M. Johnson, formerly of Medford and now of Reedsport, is one of six candidates who will receive two degrees. In addition of the doctor of medicine he will receive a master of science in medical psychology. A graduate of the University of Oregon, he will take his internship at Good Samaritan hospital, Portland.

Dr. Arthur S. Flemming, president of the University of Oregon, Eugene, will deliver the principal address at the Medical school's 75th commencement. The class will be presented by Dr. D. W. E. Baird, medical school dean, and Dr. Flemming will confer 69 doctor of medicine degrees.

Woman Leaps Into Golden Gate

San Francisco—UPI—A young woman apparently jumped to her death from the Golden Gate bridge Saturday.

The California highway patrol said the victim was identified as Jo Ann Landry, 28. Papers in her purse, found near the railing on the east side of the bridge, indicated that she had been discharged from Western State hospital, Fort Steilacoom, Wash., on May 24.

Two train tickets — one from Seattle to Oakland, the other from Seattle to San Francisco, and both dated May 31 — also were found in the purse. Other papers indicated that she was married to a merchant seaman who sails out of Bremerton, Wash., or Seattle.

No suicide notes were found.

Gamblers Anonymous

I recently read that, in this country, there must be between four and six million compulsive gamblers who never can get any where because, each month, they lose most of the money they have just earned; it all goes down the drain at the "track" or in a back room somewhere.

As the writer of the article said, with many men, gambling is almost as destructive a disease as alcoholism or addiction to heroin. I know an able man whose wife and children always are dependent on charity because every

week, when he gets his pay check, he goes straight to a gambling place where he stays until he has lost every cent. Because of this sort of thing, some kindly men are now organizing groups of "Gamblers Anonymous," something like the groups of Alcoholics Anonymous, Al-Anon, Al-Ateen and Divorcees Anonymous.

On Overcoming Sterility

The other day when in Houston, I dropped in to visit Dr. Erwin O. Strassmann. He, an able gynecologist, for years has been a student of sterility in women. In many cases, of course, the woman's failure to conceive is her husband's fault and not hers. Occasionally, something can be done to make him more fertile, but often nothing can be done for him.

When the husband is all right and the woman is not functioning well, something can sometimes be done with drugs. That it can be done is shown by the fact that the walls of Dr. Strassmann's examining room are covered with pictures of women, each with a child or two that the woman bore after she had been treated for her infertility. Dr. Strassmann now insists that every one of his patients, when she gets the child that her arms have been aching for, will send him a picture of herself and her baby.

Medford Is In Book on Traveling With Children

Wonderful places to take children in Medford and its environs are described in a new kind of guidebook for adults traveling with children.

Entitled "Wonderful Places To Take Children," the book was made possible by the co-operation of hundreds of people throughout the country who described their favorite spots to authors Jane and Theodore Norman and the National Recreation association.

The Medford attractions listed in the guidebook include the famous "river running" expeditions on Rogue

river. Points of interest to children in the environs include Cave Junction, Gold Hill, the Methodist church at Jacksonville, the Pacific coast (Astoria south to Gold Beach), the old Oregon Trail, Aquarium, and Short Sands Beach State park (Seaside); Haystack rock at Canon Beach, Tillamook County Creamery association at Tillamook, Tillamook burn and the Tillamook Tree Farm; Oceanside, Depoe Bay, Newport (the Yaquina Head Light Marine Gardens), the beach from Yachats to Heceta Head, Florence (the Sea Lion caves), Coos Bay, the Prehistoric

Gardens at Port Orford, and Gold Beach.

Three Books

The guidebook is actually three books — one covering the West, one the Central and Southern states, and one covering New England and the Middle Atlantic states. The books come in a plastic, over-the-shoulder bag for easy carrying and on-the-spot reference.

The National Recreation association is the non-profit service organization that for 56 years has been helping Americans make better use of their free time. Each volume of the guide-

book sells for only \$2.95 (\$7.95 per set) and may be ordered through the Book center, National Recreation association, 8 West Eighth st., New York 11, New York.
