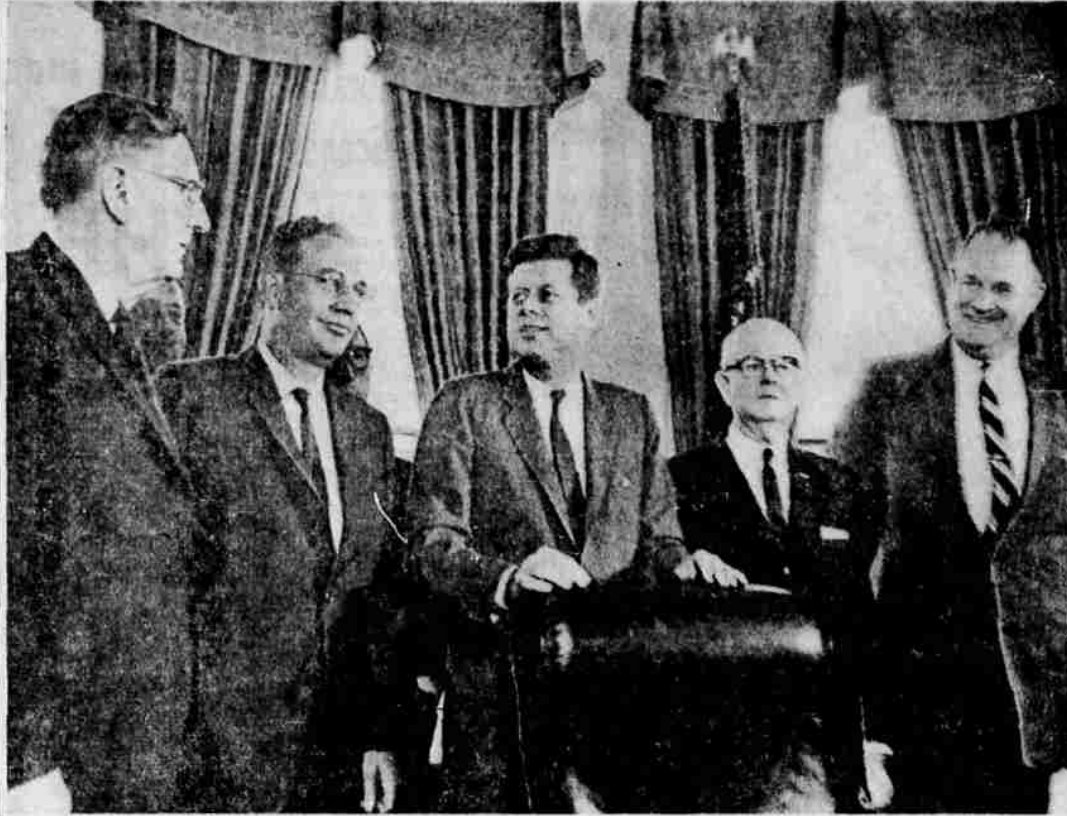

Russia Summons Satellites To Talk Plans for Economy

Editor's note - A Communist summer meeting opens Wednesday in Moscow. What's behind the move? The chief diplomatic correspondent in Europe for United Press International spotlights one of the major reasons.

By K. C. THALER London - (UPI) - Russia, alarmed at the prospect of a widening West European community, is out to meet the challenge with a Red "Common Market."

The summit meeting of Communist leaders in Moscow Wednesday is to deal with this problem, as one of the most acute on a wide agenda of topics. The Kremlin's suspected real aim has been to get control over the satellites' economies and to make them dependent on Russia beyond the hope of their turning to the West.

The Kremlin leaders, plagued by agricultural and other economic problems, cannot have failed to notice the marked progress in the West. The signs are that considerable adjustments will be needed in the Red bloc, including one in the system of pricing which has been out of touch with reality. Russia's latest modification in essential food prices and Khrushchev's frank explanation have showed that evidently a review is in order of the inadequacy of trade, aid, and over-all economic patterns which are frozen into uneasy equilibrium by Soviet domination.
