Probers Summon Former Official In Estes Case

Washington—The House government operations subcommittee today summoned an Agriculture Department official who was fired for his connections with Billie Sol Estes.

The subcommittee said Dr. James T. Ralph would be the first witness at resumption of hearings into Estes' grain storage operations.

Ralph was an assistant secretary in charge of the Agriculture Stabilization and Conservation Service, through which Estes worked many of his alleged schemes. Ralph was demoted last February and was training to be agricultural attache to the Philippines when Secretary Orville Freeman fired him.

Charges Phone Calls

The department said Ralph was fired because he charged personal telephone calls to Estes.

Ralph told United Press International that he charged three telephone calls to a credit card he did not know belonged to Estes.

Other congressional news:

Aid: Senate Democratic leaders hoped to muster enough votes to ward off another setback to President Kennedy's \$4.6 billion foreign aid bill. Democratic Leader Mike Mansfield (D-Mont.) said he would do his best to defeat a proposed amendment that would cut \$400 million out of the bill.

Taxes: Senate liberals figure the House has given them a new means of forcing action on the administration's tax reform bill. They hoped to use a House-passed \$4 billion tax extension bill to pry the reform measure out of the Senate Finance Committee.

19 Oregon Seniors Get Scholarships

Eugene—A total of \$5,900 in scholarships to 19 Oregon high school seniors who plan to attend the University of Oregon next fall has been awarded by the University of Oregon Dads, statewide organization of fathers of university students.

A \$300 scholarship went to William Wolke, Grants Pass. The UO Dads announced 170 certificate awards to special honors scholars, high school senior outstanding in scholarship and leadership, and 133 certificate awards of honors for leadership.

Special Honors Scholars from the Medford area include Joel W. Gregory and Sandra D. Shugart, both of Medford; and Patrick M. Meyer, Eagle Point.
