Instructor-Training Course Is Planned

An instructor-training course in care of the sick and injured will be taught by Miss Pat Joyce, Red Cross nursing service representative, June 20, 21 and 22 at the Red Cross building, 60 Hawthorne ave., Medford.

The course, often referred to as "home nursing," is training President Kennedy has asked a member of every family to take as part of the national Civil Defense program.

The purpose of the three-day course is to train instructors who, in turn, will teach at least one community class a year. Teachers, nurses and women with the ability to learn and explain procedures to others are eligible to register for instruction.

Red Cross officials are hoping that several individuals from Ashland, Phoenix, Talent, Eagle Point, Central Point, Shady Cove, Gold Hill, Jacksonville, Applegate, Rogue River, Butte Falls and Prospect will register to learn to teach this course.

The three day classes will meet from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. Interested women are asked to take sack lunches; coffee will be provided. Registration may be made and additional information obtained from the Red Cross office, 772-4405.
