

Rogue Gallery Showing Works of Portland Man

A retrospective show of a young Portland artist now living in Australia, is on exhibit at the Rogue gallery. The artist, Frank Elliott, has been residing in Europe and Australia for the past six years. The present exhibit consists of paintings, in oil and watercolor, drawings and lithographs, some completed while he was living in Portland, the majority executed during his travels and studies in Europe.

Mr. Elliott received his degree in art from Lewis and Clark college and then did advance work at the Portland Art museum. In Europe he studied at the Academy of Art in Florence, Italy, and later with Oskar Kokoschka, the famous German Expressionist.

His work ranges from the representational to the semi-abstract. Mr. Elliott is also an accomplished musician and is well known in Europe and Australia for his small jazz combo. Many of his latest paintings are concerned with jazz, presenting jazz performers or dancers in brilliant colors and at times in very subtle renderings. He has in addition entered many European Group showings, winning numerous awards, including two first

Pierce and Mr. and Mrs. James Lindsay.

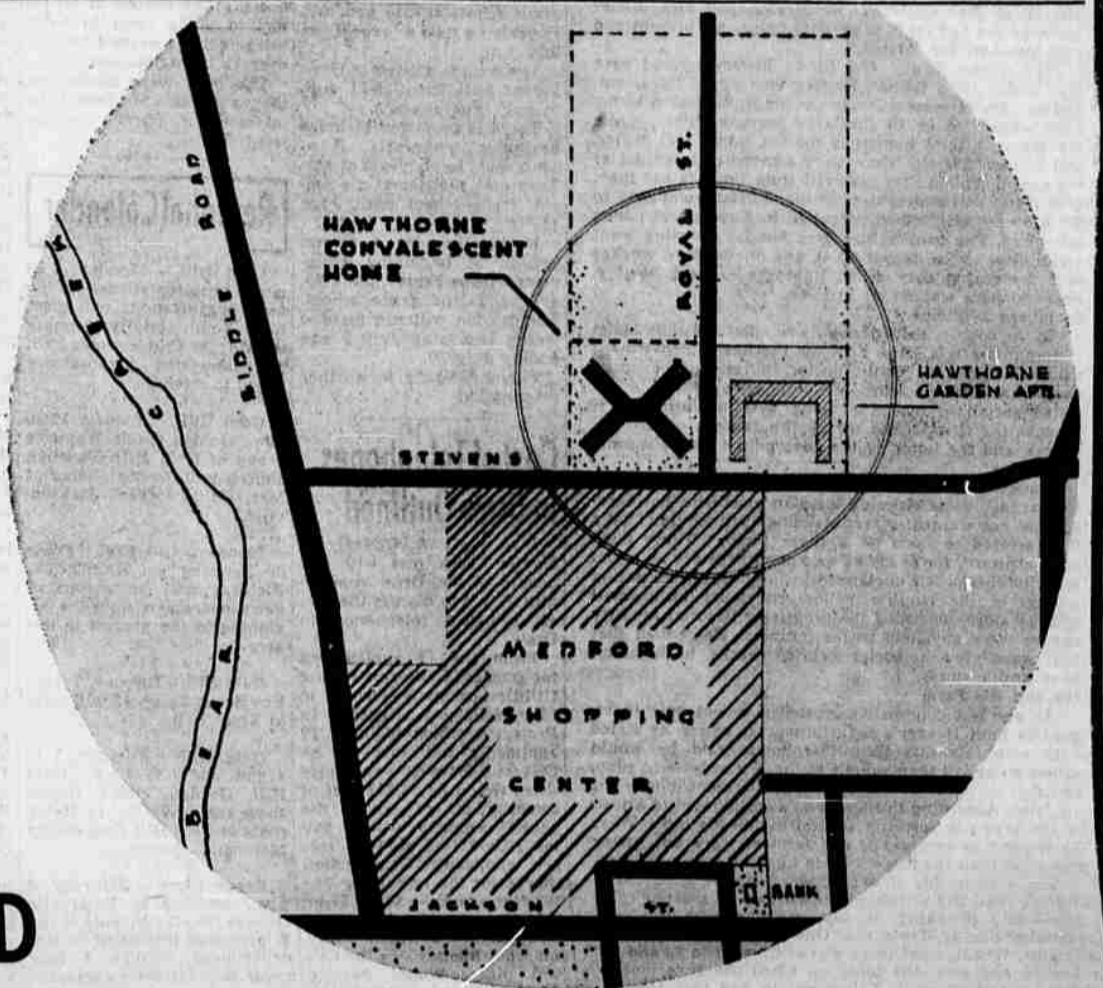
