## CORDA Directors Set New Budget

The board of directors of the California Oregon Recreation Development association last week set a new fiscal year budget of \$23,680, according to Executive Secretary and Vice President Charles Collins.

At a meeting at Lake of the Woods, recreation directors from CORDA counties reported on projects and county parks and recreation budget arrangements.

Directors voted to complete a preliminary recreation resources report on the Rogue Basin project as soon as possible. CORDA has gone on record recommending development of the Rogue basin by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, which development would restore the fishery on the Rogue.

Attending the meeting were Association President Robert Walker, Klamath county judge; Jackson County Judge Earl M. Miller; Bill McCaw, member of the board of supervisors from Modoc county; Bruce Davidson, Josephine county commissioner; and visitors Louis Ringuette, Josephine county commissioner, and a representative from the Redwood Empire association.

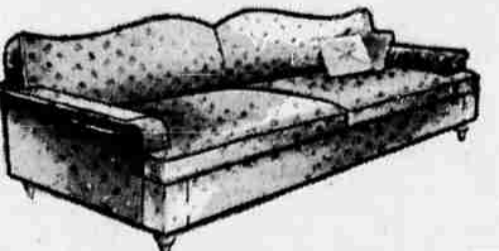

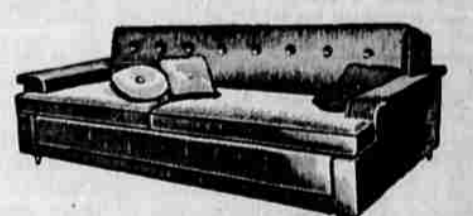
