Aquatic School For Youth Slated To Open Today

The first youth aquatic school to be conducted under American Red Cross supervision will open today at Southern Oregon college. It will continue through June 16.

Jackson County and Klamath Basin chapter of the Red Cross are sponsors of the pilot program. Purpose is to train young people in basic boating, basic canoeing, life-saving, water safety and first aid. National officials have informed the local chapters that they are the first in the Red Cross organization to attempt such a school.

Mrs. Roy Wilkes, Medford, water safety chairman for the Jackson chapter, is school director.

Registration Limited

The training is for young people 15 through 17 years of age. Registration is limited to 40 students: 22 from Jackson county and 18 from Klamath will attend the session. Students will be housed in college dormitories and will use other campus facilities.

Part of the instruction will be at Twin Plunges in Ashland and another part at Rene L. Bounds lake.

Both junior and senior life saving will be taught. Training will be offered for water safety aide (instructor's assistant). Basic boating will include rowboats and motor boats. Standard or advanced first aid is on the curricula.

Instructors will include Dr. Ruth Beber, director of Southern Oregon college's women's physical education department; Robert Bennett, assistant professor of physical education at the college; Lawrence Jones, student at University of Puget Sound and Main pool staff member; Mrs. Lowell Jones, small craft chairman for Klamath county, and Granville Thomas, who has retired as a member of the University of California PE department.

Taught at Schools

Thomas has taught at several Red Cross national aquatic schools and Dr. Beber has taught at one. She was water safety instructor trainer. Mrs. Wilkes, Jones and Mrs. Jones have attended ARC national aquatic schools. Thomas is founder of the water safety program and was director of small craft training in the San Francisco ARC chapter.

Mrs. Wilkes is the women's program director at the Medford YMCA and will direct Y camp this year. She has worked as waterfront director for Camp Fire Girls.

Bennett is a water safety and first aid instructor. Jones has conducted Klamath county's swim program at Crescent lake for two years. Mrs. Jones holds water safety and canoe instructorships and has served for seven years as Girl Scout camp waterfront director.

Successful completion of the courses in the junior training session will provide a foundation for students to go on to instructor status after becoming 18 years of age.

Chest X-Rays Topic Of Television Show

"Why Have a Chest X-ray?" will be the topic for discussion on "Adventures in Medicine" at 3:30 o'clock this afternoon over station KBES-TV.

With the mobile chest x-ray unit in the county during June, the first time in 10 years, the Jackson County Tuberculosis and Health association is emphasizing the importance of the chest x-ray as one of the two most effective methods of finding early pulmonary tuberculosis.

According to Chester Irish, association president, other respiratory diseases such as emphysema, bronchiectasis, and pneumonias often show up in a chest x-ray. Tumors, cancer, and certain heart conditions also are often found by this means, he said.

Three Medford physicians, Dr. Earl L. Lawson, radiologist, Dr. James W. Quinn, thoracic surgeon, and Dr. Thomas J. Tinsley, pathologist, will discuss the importance of the chest x-rays as a diagnostic aid.

Chest films and laboratory procedures will be shown and described to illustrate how certain chest disorders are detected and treated.
