

### Stockmen Tell of Plans to Reclaim Valley Flood Land

Salem — (UPI) — A group of stockmen from northern Warner Valley in Lake county resubmitted a plan for reclaiming about 8,000 acres in the southern part of the valley to the Oregon Land Board Tuesday. The board asked for more details.

The area involved is the Crump Lake flood plain.

At the same time, a group from the valley's southern sector protested the plan. William Wales, Klamath Falls engineer, said the proposed program isn't feasible from an engineering standpoint.

**Group Led**  
The Northern Warner valley group was led by Lakeview attorney Forest E. Cooper.

Southern Warner Valley group was led by Ted Conn, also a Lakeview attorney.

Cooper's group is proposing a flood control, irrigation and grazing land rehabilitation project in the southern section, which lies within a 10,000 acre stretch of swamp-land owned by the land board. The site is about 25 miles east of Lakeview.

State Engineer Chris Wheeler and other state officials said a great deal more engineering work must be done before the proposal will be understandable.

### New Three-Year Contract Signed As Strike Ends

Spokane — (UPI) — The 28-day-old Inland Empire construction strike which has idled some 9,000 men came to an end Tuesday with the announcement that the Teamsters and the Associated General Contractors had come to terms.

In a joint announcement, Les Johnson of the AGC and J. E. Whitney of the union announced ratification of a three-year contract calling for a 61-cent hourly package increase, travel pay and a hiring procedure.

Johnson and Whitney said the agreement had been accepted by a majority vote of the contractors and some 400 striking members of the Teamsters Union.

**Pay Hike**  
Under terms of the agreement, the Teamsters will receive a 16-cent hourly increase when they return to work, another 20-cent increase May 1, 1963, and the other 15-cent pay hike May 1, 1964.

Also included in the agreement is a five-cent an hour increase on health and welfare payments and a five-cent increase in pension fund payments.

The Teamsters struck construction projects in the area May 28.

Some 5,000 carpenters came to terms with the AGC last Friday. The strike of the two groups had halted work on some \$200 million worth of construction projects since May 16, when the carpenters walked off their jobs.

### Astronaut Aided After Gear Trouble

Miami — (UPI) — Astronaut Virgil I. Gus Grissom was helped out of a tight spot Tuesday while piloting a jet fighter 44,000 feet over Jacksonville, Fla.

Grissom, an Air Force captain, was en route from Pope Field, N.C., to Patrick Air Force Base near Cape Canaveral when the navigational equipment on his F106 stopped functioning.

The suborbital spaceman notified Patrick, which in turn called Miami's Air Route Traffic Control Center. The center was able to pick up a radar emergency signal from Grissom's jet, flying above a thunderstorm.

The Miami center said it directed Grissom safely into range of the airbase approach control, which guided the astronaut into a safe landing at Patrick.

Grissom telephoned the Miami center when he landed to extend his thanks. "I don't know how I could have gotten down without you," the astronaut said.
