Fate of Kennedy's Farm Program Hangs On Roll Call Vote

Washington—UPI—The fate of the Kennedy farm program hung on an expected close roll call vote set for today.

Administration strategists were predicting victory. Republican opponents were privately pessimistic as the House began its third and final day of debate on the administration's new approach to the farm problem.

Under the measure submitted to Congress by President Kennedy, and already approved by the Senate, the government would impose for the first time strict production controls on the planting of wheat and feed grains.

It is designed to cut surpluses that are now costing the government \$1 million a day in storage fees alone. Republican foes claim the bill would bring "regimentation and ruin" to all farmers.

GOP leaders have complained that Agriculture Secretary Orville L. Freeman has managed to "buy votes" for the measure by accepting more than a dozen floor amendments demanded by Democrats as the price of their support.

Other congressional news: Drugs—A poll of key members of the House Commerce committee indicated today that an administration-supported drug control bill appears to be dead for this session. The committee is considering the measure, which would fix tough new government controls over the production of cosmetics as well as drugs. Under the measure drug makers would have to prove that their products were effective as well as safe.

Entertainers—The Senate rackets subcommittee was expected today to continue exploring charges that leaders of the entertainers union received illegal favors. A subcommittee spokesman would only say today's session would take up a Florida case that was similar to favors allegedly given to Jackie Bright, administrative secretary of the

Bodies Found in Airplane Wreckage

Helena, Mont.—UPI—The bodies of four Washington persons were found in the wreckage of a light plane on Scapegoat Mountain 65 air miles northwest of here Wednesday evening.

Lewis and Clark County Sheriff-Coroner Dave Middlemas, who went to the scene in a Fish and Game Department helicopter, said the bodies were all inside the Cessna 175 and easily identifiable.

The plane crashed on the mountain sometime Friday afternoon and had been the object of an extensive search since Monday morning. It was piloted by L. V. Richards of Outlook, Wash. Also in the plane were Richards' wife, and their son-in-law and daughter, the Rev. and Mrs. Robert Smith of Sunnyside.

Middlemas said he would join a crew from Malmstrom Air Force Base today and fly to the scene to recover the bodies.

Malmstrom officials are providing a large helicopter for the mission, he said.
